## ADOPTED SENATE

## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Encouraging support for the display of the Ten Commandments as a Constitutional
- 2 acknowledgment of God by local governments and the State of Georgia; and for other
- 3 purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, the United States Constitution is the supreme law of the land; and
- 5 WHEREAS, every state and federal public official is "bound by Oath or Affirmation to
- 6 support this Constitution"; and
- 7 WHEREAS, it is the duty of a court or judge to interpret the law, not to make the law; and
- 8 WHEREAS, to prohibit the recognition of God not only contradicts the purpose of the First
- 9 Amendment to the United States Constitution, but also is an unlawful order and extrajudicial
- 10 in nature; and
- 11 WHEREAS, the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment requires only that "Congress
- shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion" and does not prohibit public
- 13 acknowledgments of God; and
- 14 WHEREAS, a public monument, display, or framed picture of anything, including the Ten
- 15 Commandments, whether hung on a wall or displayed in a public area or hallway, cannot be
- 16 a "law" simply because it appears in a public building; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the Ten Commandments, which is the foundational moral code for our nation,
- 18 in part states:
- 19 I. I am the LORD thy God. Thou shalt have no other gods before me.
- 20 II. Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image.
- 21 III. Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God in vain.
- IV. Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy.

1 V. Honor thy father and thy mother that thy days may be long upon the land which the

- 2 LORD thy God giveth thee.
- WI. Thou shalt not kill.
- 4 VII. Thou shalt not commit adultery.
- 5 VIII. Thou shalt not steal.
- 6 IX. Thou shalt not commit false witness against thy neighbor.
- 7 X. Thou shalt not covet anything that is thy neighbor's; and
- 8 WHEREAS, "religion" under the First Amendment is defined as "[t]he duty which we owe
- 9 to our Creator, and the manner of discharging it," and while a display of the Ten
- 10 Commandments certainly lists several duties owed to the Creator, it does not dictate the
- manner of discharging these duties, such being left to the purview of conscience; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the Declaration of Independence, our Nation's charter, is filled with
- 13 recognitions of a Providential God Who has endowed us with "certain unalienable rights";
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, every state constitution acknowledges God, and the Constitution of Georgia is
- 16 no exception; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court is to make a ruling using, for the first time,
- oral arguments and written briefs on the merits of displaying the Ten Commandments in
- 19 public places.
- 20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that, in order to remind our
- 21 citizens of the constitutionality of publicly displaying the Ten Commandments in
- 22 government buildings, this body encourages our citizens to support the public display of the
- 23 Ten Commandments and other historical documents that acknowledge God in the founding
- 24 and establishing of our nation.
- 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body encourages the Governor of Georgia to
- 26 continue to support those public displays of the Ten Commandments that already exist in our
- 27 state, as well as promote the practice of displaying the Ten Commandments in public
- 28 buildings as an appropriate way to acknowledge God, the moral foundation of our laws.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body exhorts the United States Supreme Court to

- 2 follow the historical intent of the framers of the Constitution, as is testified by the
- 3 Congressional record, and restore the original intent of the First Amendment.
- 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 5 to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to the Governor and the United States
- 6 Supreme Court, and to make copies readily available to the local officials of the State of
- 7 Georgia.
