

House Bill 650 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend an Act changing the compensation of the clerk of the superior court, the sheriff,  
2 and the judge of the Probate Court of Cobb County from the fee system to the salary system,  
3 approved February 9, 1949 (Ga. L. 1949, p. 427), as amended, particularly by an Act  
4 approved April 25, 2002 (Ga. L. 2002, p. 4834) and by an Act approved May 17, 2004 (Ga.  
5 L. 2004, p. 3838), so as to change the compensation of the judge and the clerk of the  
6 probate court; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 An Act changing the compensation of the clerk of the superior court, the sheriff, and the  
10 judge of the Probate Court of Cobb County from the fee system to the salary system,  
11 approved February 9, 1949 (Ga. L. 1949, p. 427), as amended, particularly by an Act  
12 approved April 25, 2002 (Ga. L. 2002, p. 4834) and by an Act approved May 17, 2004 (Ga.  
13 L. 2004, p. 3838), is amended by striking in its entirety Section 2A and inserting in its place  
14 a new Section 2A to read as follows:

15 "SECTION 2A.

16 The judge of the Probate Court of Cobb County shall receive an annual salary of  
17 \$104,098.54, to be paid in equal monthly installments from the funds of Cobb County."

18 **SECTION 2.**

19 Said Act is further amended by striking in its entirety the second sentence of Section 3 and  
20 inserting in its place a new sentence to read as follows:

21 "The clerk of the probate court shall be compensated in the amount of \$71,986.91 per  
22 annum, payable in equal monthly installments from the funds of Cobb County."

1 **SECTION 3.**

2 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law  
3 without such approval.

4 **SECTION 4.**

5 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
