A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To create the City of East Point Public Facilities Authority; to provide a short title; to provide
2 for the appointment of members of the Authority; to confer powers upon the Authority; to
3 authorize the issuance of revenue bonds of the Authority payable from the revenues, tolls,
4 fees, charges and earnings of the Authority, contract payments to the Authority and from
5 other moneys pledged therefor and to authorize the collection and pledging of the revenues,
6 tolls, fees, charges, earnings and contract payments of the Authority for the payment of such
7 revenue bonds; to authorize the execution of resolutions and trust indentures to secure the
8 payment of the revenue bonds of the Authority and to define the rights of the holders of such
9 obligations; to make the revenue bonds of the Authority exempt from taxation; to fix and
10 provide the venue and jurisdiction of actions relating to any provisions of this Act; to provide
11 for the validation of bonds; to provide for severability; to provide an effective date; to repeal
12 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

13 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:**

14 **SECTION 1.**

15 Short title.

16 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "City of East Point Public Facilities
17 Authority Act."

18 **SECTION 2.**

19 City of East Point Public Facilities Authority.

20 (a) There is hereby created a public body corporate and politic to be known as the "City
21 of East Point Public Facilities Authority," which shall be deemed to be a political
22 subdivision of the State and a public corporation, and by that name, style and title said
23 body may contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded and

1 complain and defend in all courts of law and equity. The Authority shall have perpetual
2 existence.

3 (b) The Authority shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by the Mayor of
4 the City of East Point. With respect to the initial appointment by the Mayor of the City of
5 East Point, two members shall be appointed for a term of three years, two members shall
6 be appointed for a term of two years, and one member shall be appointed for a term of one
7 year. Thereafter, all appointments shall be made for terms of three years and until
8 successors are appointed and qualified. Immediately after such appointments the members
9 of the Authority shall enter upon their duties. To be eligible for appointment as a member
10 of the Authority a person shall be at least twenty-one years of age, a resident of the City
11 of East Point, Georgia for at least two years prior to the date of his or her appointment, and
12 shall not have been convicted of a felony. Any member of the Authority may be selected
13 and appointed to succeed himself or herself.

14 (c) The City Council of the City of East Point may provide by resolution for compensation
15 for the services of the members of the Authority in such amounts as it may deem
16 appropriate; provided, however, that such members shall be reimbursed for their actual
17 expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of their duties.

18 (d) The members of the Authority shall elect one of their number as Chairperson and
19 another as a Vice-Chairperson. The members of the Authority shall also elect a Secretary,
20 who need not be a member of the Authority, and may also elect a Treasurer, who need not
21 be a member of the Authority. The Secretary may also serve as Treasurer. If the Secretary
22 or Treasurer is not a member of the Authority, such officer shall have no voting rights.
23 Each of such officers shall serve for a period of one year and until their successors are duly
24 elected and qualified.

25 (e) Three members of the Authority shall constitute a quorum. No vacancy on the
26 Authority shall impair the right of the quorum to exercise all of the rights and perform all
27 of the duties of the Authority.

28 **SECTION 3.**

29 Definitions.

30 As used in this Act, the term:

31 (1) "Authority" means the City of East Point Public Facilities Authority created by this
32 Act.

33 (2) "Costs of the Project" means and embraces the cost of construction; the cost of all
34 lands, properties, rights, easements and franchises acquired; the cost of all machinery and
35 equipment; financing charges; interest prior to and during construction and for six months

1 after completion of construction; the cost of engineering, architectural, fiscal agents' and
 2 legal expenses, plans and specifications, and other expenses necessary or incidental to
 3 determining the feasibility or practicability of the Project; administrative expenses, and
 4 such other expenses as may be necessary or incident to the financing herein authorized;
 5 working capital; and all other costs necessary to acquire, construct, add to, extend,
 6 improve, equip, operate and maintain the Project.

7 (3) "Project" means (A) all buildings, facilities and equipment necessary or convenient for
 8 the efficient operation of the City of East Point, Georgia, or any department, agency,
 9 division or commission thereof and (B) any "undertaking" permitted by the Revenue Bond
 10 Law.

11 (4) "Revenue Bond Law" means the Revenue Bond Law of the State of Georgia codified
 12 at Code Section 36-82-60 et seq. of the O.C.G.A., as amended, or any other similar law
 13 hereinafter enacted.

14 (5) "Revenue Bonds" means revenue bonds authorized to be issued pursuant to this Act.

15 (6) "Self-liquidating" means any Project which the revenues and earnings to be derived by
 16 the Authority therefrom, including but not limited to any contractual payments with
 17 governmental or private entities, and all properties used, leased, and sold in connection
 18 therewith, together with any grants, will be sufficient to pay the costs of operating,
 19 maintaining and repairing the Project and to pay the principal and interest on the Revenue
 20 Bonds or other obligations which may be issued for the purpose of paying the Costs of the
 21 Project.

22 (7) "State" means the State of Georgia.

23 **SECTION 4.**

24 Powers.

25 The Authority shall have the power:

26 (1) To have a seal and alter the same at its pleasure;

27 (2) To acquire by purchase, lease, gift, condemnation, or otherwise, and to hold, operate,
 28 maintain, lease, and dispose of real and personal property of every kind and character for
 29 its corporate purposes;

30 (3) To acquire in its own name by purchase, on such terms and conditions and in such
 31 manner as it may deem proper, or by condemnation in accordance with the provisions of
 32 any and all existing laws applicable to the condemnation of property for public use, real
 33 property or rights or easements therein, or franchises necessary or convenient for its
 34 corporate purposes, and to use the same so long as its corporate existence shall continue,
 35 and to lease or make contracts with respect to the use of or dispose of the same in any

1 manner it deems to the best advantage of the Authority, the Authority being under no
2 obligation to accept and pay for any property condemned under this Act, except from the
3 funds provided under the authority of this Act, and in any proceedings to condemn, such
4 orders may be made by the court having jurisdiction of the suit, action or proceedings as
5 may be just to the Authority and to the owners of the property to be condemned, and no
6 property shall be acquired under the provisions of this Act upon which any lien or
7 encumbrance exists, unless at the time such property is so acquired a sufficient sum of
8 money is to be deposited in trust to pay and redeem the fair value of such lien or
9 encumbrance;

10 (4) To appoint, select and employ officers, agents and employees, including engineering
11 architectural and construction experts, fiscal agents and attorneys, and fix their respective
12 compensations;

13 (5) To execute contracts, leases, installment sale agreements and other agreements and
14 instruments necessary or convenient in connection with the acquisition, construction,
15 addition, extension, improvement, equipping, operation or maintenance of a Project; and
16 any and all persons, firms and corporations, the City of East Point, Georgia, and Fulton
17 County, Georgia are hereby authorized to enter into contracts, leases, installment sale
18 agreements and other agreements or instruments with the Authority upon such terms and
19 for such purposes as they deem advisable and as they are authorized by law;

20 (6) To acquire, construct, add to, extend, improve, equip, hold, operate, maintain, lease and
21 dispose of Projects;

22 (7) To pay the Costs of the Project with the proceeds of Revenue Bonds or other
23 obligations issued by the Authority or from any grant or contribution from the United
24 States of America or any agency or instrumentality thereof or from the State or any agency
25 or instrumentality or other political subdivision thereof or from any other source
26 whatsoever;

27 (8) To accept loans and grants of money or materials or property of any kind from the
28 United States of America or any agency or instrumentality thereof, upon such terms and
29 conditions as the United States of America or such agency or instrumentality may require;

30 (9) To accept loans and grants of money or materials or property of any kind from the
31 State or any agency or instrumentality or political subdivision thereof, upon such terms and
32 conditions as the State or such agency or instrumentality or political subdivision may
33 require;

34 (10) To borrow money for any of its corporate purposes and to issue Revenue Bonds, and
35 to provide for the payment of the same and for the rights of the holders thereof;

1 (11) To exercise any power usually possessed by private corporations performing similar
2 functions, including the power to incur short-term debt and to approve, execute, and deliver
3 appropriate evidence of any such indebtedness; and

4 (12) To do all things necessary or convenient to carry out the powers expressly given in
5 this Act.

6 **SECTION 5.**

7 Revenue bonds.

8 The Authority, or any authority or body which has or which may in the future succeed to the
9 powers, duties and liabilities vested in the Authority created hereby, shall have power and
10 is hereby authorized to provide by resolution for the issuance of Revenue Bonds of the
11 Authority for the purpose of paying all or any part of the Costs of the Project and for the
12 purpose of refunding Revenue Bonds or other obligations previously issued. The principal
13 of and interest on such Revenue Bonds shall be payable solely from the special fund hereby
14 provided for such payment. The Revenue Bonds of each issue shall be dated, shall bear
15 interest at such rate or rates per annum, payable at such time or times, shall mature at such
16 time or times not exceeding forty years from their date or dates, shall be payable in such
17 medium of payment as to both principal and interest as may be determined by the Authority
18 and may be redeemable before maturity, at the option of the Authority, at such price or prices
19 and under such terms and conditions as may be fixed by the Authority in the resolution for
20 the issuance of such Revenue Bonds.

21 **SECTION 6.**

22 Same; form; denomination; registration; place of payment.

23 The Authority shall determine the form of the Revenue Bonds and shall fix the denomination
24 or denominations of the Revenue Bonds. The Revenue Bonds may be issued in coupon or
25 registered form, or both, as the Authority may determine, and provision may be made for
26 registration and exchangeability privileges. The Authority shall fix the place or places of
27 payment of principal and interest thereon.

28 **SECTION 7.**

29 Same; signatures; seal.

30 All such Revenue Bonds shall bear the manual or facsimile signature of the Chairperson or
31 Vice-Chairperson of the Authority and the attesting manual or facsimile signature of the

1 Secretary, Assistant Secretary, or Secretary-Treasurer of the Authority, and the official seal
2 of the Authority shall be impressed or imprinted thereon. Any coupons attached thereto shall
3 bear the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson and the
4 Secretary, Assistant Secretary, or Secretary-Treasurer of the Authority. Any Revenue Bonds
5 or coupons attached thereto may bear the manual or facsimile signature of such persons as
6 at the actual time of the execution of such Revenue Bonds or coupons shall be duly
7 authorized or hold the proper office, although at the date of issuance of such Revenue Bonds
8 such person may not have been so authorized or shall not have held such office. In case any
9 officer whose signature shall appear on any Revenue Bond or any coupon shall cease to be
10 such officer before the delivery of such Revenue Bond, such signature shall nevertheless be
11 valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if that person had remained in office until
12 such delivery.

13 **SECTION 8.**

14 Same; negotiability; exemption from taxation.

15 All Revenue Bonds shall have and are hereby declared to have all the qualities and incidents
16 of negotiable instruments under the laws of the State. All Revenue Bonds, their transfer and
17 the income therefrom shall be exempt from all taxation within the State.

18 **SECTION 9.**

19 Same; sale; price; proceeds.

20 The Authority may sell Revenue Bonds in such manner and for such price as it may
21 determine to be in the best interest of the Authority. The proceeds derived from the sale of
22 Revenue Bonds shall be used solely for the purpose or purposes provided in the resolutions
23 and proceedings authorizing the issuance of such Revenue Bonds.

24 **SECTION 10.**

25 Same; interim receipts and certificates or temporary bonds.

26 Prior to the preparation of any definitive Revenue Bonds, the Authority may, under like
27 restrictions, issue interim receipts, interim certificates or temporary Revenue Bonds, with or
28 without coupons, exchangeable for definitive Revenue Bonds upon the issuance of the latter.

SECTION 11.

Same; replacement of lost or mutilated bonds.

The Authority may provide for the replacement of any Revenue Bonds or coupons which shall become mutilated or be destroyed or lost.

SECTION 12.

Same; conditions precedent to issuance.

The Authority shall adopt a resolution authorizing the issuance of the Revenue Bonds. In the resolution, the Authority shall determine that the Project financed with the proceeds of the Revenue Bonds is Self-liquidating. Revenue Bonds may be issued without any other proceedings or the happening of any other conditions or things other than those proceedings, conditions and things which are specified or required by this Act. Any resolution providing for the issuance of Revenue Bonds under the provisions of this Act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and need not be published or posted, and any such resolution may be passed at any regular or special or adjourned meeting of the Authority by a majority of its members.

SECTION 13.

Credit not pledged.

Revenue Bonds shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the City of East Point, Georgia nor a pledge of the faith and credit of said municipality, but such Revenue Bonds shall be payable solely from the fund hereinafter provided. The issuance of such Revenue Bonds shall not directly, indirectly or contingently obligate said municipality to levy or to pledge any form of taxation whatsoever for payment of such Revenue Bonds or to make any appropriation for their payment, and all such Revenue Bonds shall contain recitals on their face covering substantially the foregoing provisions of this section. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, this Act shall not affect the ability of the Authority and any political subdivision or municipality to enter into an intergovernmental contract pursuant to which the political subdivision or municipality agrees to pay amounts sufficient to pay operating charges and other costs of the Authority or any Project including, without limitation, the principal of and interest on Revenue Bonds in consideration for services or facilities of the Authority.

SECTION 14.

Trust indenture as security.

In the discretion of the Authority, any issuance of Revenue Bonds may be secured by a trust indenture by and between the Authority and a corporate trustee, which may be any trust company or bank having the powers of a trust company within or without the State. Either the resolution providing for the issuance of the Revenue Bonds or such trust indenture may contain such provisions for protecting and enforcing the rights and remedies of the bondholders as may be reasonable and proper and not in violation of law, including covenants setting forth the duties of the Authority in relation to the acquisition and construction of the Project, the maintenance, operation, repair and insuring of the Project, and the custody, safeguarding and application of all moneys.

SECTION 15.

To whom proceeds of bonds shall be paid.

In the resolution providing for the issuance of Revenue Bonds or in the trust indenture, the Authority shall provide for the payment of the proceeds of the sale of the Revenue Bonds to any officer or person who, or any agency, bank or trust company which, shall act as trustee of such funds and shall hold and apply the same to the purposes thereof, subject to such regulations as this Act and such resolution or trust indenture may provide.

SECTION 16.

Sinking fund.

The moneys received pursuant to an intergovernmental contract and the revenues, fees, tolls, charges and earnings derived from any particular Project or Projects, regardless of whether or not such revenues, fees, tolls, fines, charges and earnings were produced by a particular Project for which Revenue Bonds have been issued, unless otherwise pledged and allocated, may be pledged and allocated by the Authority to the payment of the principal and interest on Revenue Bonds of the Authority as the resolution authorizing the issuance of the Revenue Bonds or in the trust indenture may provide, and such funds so pledged from whatever source received shall be set aside at regular intervals as may be provided in the resolution or trust indenture, into a sinking fund, which said sinking fund shall be pledged to and charged with the payment of (1) the interest upon such Revenue Bonds as such interest shall fall due, (2) the principal or purchase price of such Revenue Bonds as the same shall fall due, (3) any premium upon such Revenue Bonds as the same shall fall due, (4) the purchase of such

1 Revenue Bonds in the open market, and (5) the necessary charges of the paying agent for
2 paying principal and interest. The use and disposition of such sinking fund shall be subject
3 to such regulations as may be provided in the resolution authorizing the issuance of the
4 Revenue Bonds or in the trust indenture, but, except as may otherwise be provided in such
5 resolution or trust indenture, such sinking fund shall be maintained as a trust account for the
6 benefit of all Revenue Bonds without distinction or priority of one over another.

7 **SECTION 17.**

8 Remedies of bondholders.

9 Any holder of Revenue Bonds or any of the coupons appertaining thereto, and the trustee
10 under the trust indenture, if any, except to the extent the rights herein given may be restricted
11 by resolution passed before the issuance of the Revenue Bonds or by the trust indenture,
12 may, either at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, protect and
13 enforce any and all rights under the laws of the State, including specifically but without
14 limitation, the Revenue Bond Law, or granted hereunder or under such resolution or trust
15 indenture, and may enforce and compel performance of all duties required by this Act or by
16 such resolution or trust indenture to be performed by the Authority or any officer thereof,
17 including the fixing, charging and collecting of revenues, fees, tolls, fines and other charges
18 for the use of the facilities and services furnished.

19 **SECTION 18.**

20 Validation.

21 Revenue Bonds and the security therefor shall be confirmed and validated in accordance with
22 the procedure of the Revenue Bond Law. The petition for validation shall also make party
23 defendant to such action the State, and any institution, department or other agency thereof,
24 and any county, municipality or other political subdivision or authority of the State which
25 has contracted with the Authority for services or facilities relating to the Project for which
26 Revenue Bonds are to be issued and sought to be validated, and such defendant shall be
27 required to show cause, if any exists, why such contract or contracts shall not be adjudicated
28 as a part of the basis for the security for the payment of any such Revenue Bonds. The
29 Revenue Bonds, when validated, and the judgment of validation shall be final and conclusive
30 with respect to such Revenue Bonds and the security for the payment thereof and interest
31 thereon and against the Authority and all other defendants.

SECTION 19.

Venue and jurisdiction.

Any action to protect or enforce any rights under the provisions of this Act or any suit or action against such Authority shall be brought in the Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, and any action pertaining to validation of any Revenue Bonds issued under the provisions of this Act shall likewise be brought in said court which shall have exclusive, original jurisdiction of such actions.

SECTION 20.

Interest of bondholders protected.

While any of the Revenue Bonds issued by the Authority remain outstanding, the powers, duties or existence of said Authority or its officers, employees or agents shall not be diminished or impaired in any manner that will affect adversely the interests and rights of the holders of such Revenue Bonds, and no other entity, department, agency or authority will be created which will compete with the Authority to such an extent as to affect adversely the interest and rights of the holders of such Revenue Bonds, nor will the State itself so compete with the Authority. The provisions of this Act shall be for the benefit of the Authority and the holders of any such Revenue Bonds and, upon the issuance of such Revenue Bonds under the provisions hereof, shall constitute a contract with the holders of such Revenue Bonds.

SECTION 21.

Moneys received considered trust funds.

All moneys received pursuant to the authority of this Act, whether as proceeds from the sale of Revenue Bonds, as grants or other contributions, or as revenue, income, fees and earnings, shall be deemed to be trust funds to be held and applied solely as provided in this Act.

SECTION 22.

Purpose of the Authority.

Without limiting the generality of any provision of this Act, the general purpose of the Authority is declared to be that of providing buildings, facilities, equipment and services for the citizens in the City of East Point, Georgia.

SECTION 23.

Rates, charges and revenues; use.

The Authority is hereby authorized to prescribe and fix rates and to revise same from time to time and to collect revenues, tolls, fees and charges for the services, facilities and commodities furnished, and in anticipation of the collection of the revenues, to issue Revenue Bonds or other types of obligations as herein provided to finance, in whole or in part, the Costs of the Project, and to pledge to the punctual payment of said Revenue Bonds or other obligations, all or any part of the revenues.

SECTION 24.

Rules, regulations, service policies and procedures for operation of projects.

It shall be the duty of the Authority to prescribe or cause to be prescribed rules, regulations, service policies and procedures for the operation of any Project or Projects constructed or acquired under the provisions of this Act. The Authority may adopt bylaws.

SECTION 25.

Tort immunity.

To the extent permitted by law, the Authority shall have the same immunity and exemption from liability for torts and negligence as the City of East Point, Georgia; and the officers, agents and employees of the Authority when in the performance of the work of the Authority shall have the same immunity and exemption from liability for torts and negligence as the officers, agents and employees of the City of East Point, Georgia when in the performance of their public duties or work of said municipality.

SECTION 26.

Tax-exempt status of authority.

The properties of the Authority, both real and personal, are declared to be public properties used for the benefit and welfare of the people of the State and not for purposes of private or corporate benefit and income, and such properties and the Authority shall be exempt from all taxes and special assessments of any municipality, county, or the State and any political subdivision thereof.

SECTION 27.

Effect on other governments.

This Act shall not and does not in any way take from the City of East Point, Georgia the authority to own, operate and maintain public facilities or to issue revenue bonds as provided by the Revenue Bond Law.

SECTION 28.

Liberal construction of Act.

This Act, being for the welfare of various political subdivisions and municipalities of the State and its inhabitants, shall be liberally construed to effect the purposes hereof.

SECTION 29.

Severability; effect of partial invalidity of Act.

The provisions of this Act are severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the decision of such court shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions.

SECTION 30.

Effective date.

This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

SECTION 31.

Repeal.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.
