A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Department of Transportation to proceed with the initiation in 2005 of a pilot
- 2 performance based asset maintenance project for highway maintenance; and for other
- 3 purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia, like many states throughout the country today, is facing
- 5 tough challenges with transportation infrastructure; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the Georgia Department of Transportation currently operates, maintains, and
- 7 improves the existing 19,853 miles of roads and highways in Georgia; and
- 8 WHEREAS, vehicle miles traveled on our roadways in Georgia continue to increase, while
- 9 budgetary constraints make it more and more difficult to keep up with the overwhelming
- 10 needs of the traveling public; and
- 11 WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration has estimated that 20 percent of the
- bridges in Georgia are either structurally obsolete or deficient; and
- WHEREAS, the Governor, the General Assembly, and the Department of Transportation are
- 14 attempting to meet these challenges and are deserving of support in fully exploring all
- avenues for innovation and improvement; and
- WHEREAS, the legislative committee governing the Department of Transportation budget
- held a hearing in 2005 to hear testimony on "best practices" in other states including piloting
- programs involving a "performance based asset management" approach to transportation
- 19 maintenance; and
- 20 WHEREAS, particularly the State of Florida's Department of Transportation has embarked
- 21 upon an asset management program for maintenance that has generated proven cost savings
- of 17 percent without impacting the level of service; and

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1 WHEREAS, the Georgia Department of Transportation has experienced problems with

- 2 hiring and retaining road maintenance employees, resulting in an impairment of necessary
- 3 preservation and maintenance in some areas of the state; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives is committed to investigating new and innovative
- 5 means to save tax dollars while at the same time providing a high level of service to the
- 6 citizens of our state; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the commissioner of the Department of Transportation has during the past year
- 8 reviewed the feasibility of applying asset management concepts to highway maintenance in
- 9 Georgia.
- 10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 11 the members of this body request the Department of Transportation to proceed with the
- initiation in 2005 of a pilot performance based asset maintenance project for highway
- maintenance in a location or district it deems most feasible for the benefit of the citizens of
- 14 the State of Georgia.
- 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the commissioner of the
- 17 Department of Transportation.
