- 2 WHEREAS, on March 7, 2005, the State of Georgia lost one of its finest and most
3 distinguished citizens with the passing of John Cox; and
- 4 WHEREAS, he was an honest and dedicated man who strived for excellence in all his
5 endeavors as evidenced dramatically by his service as a scout leader and scout master, his
6 active involvement with Dunwoody United Methodist Church, and his outstanding service
7 as lobbyist for the Georgia Association of Realtors; and
- 8 WHEREAS, he served his country with honor and distinction as a member of the United
9 States Army Air Corp during World War II; and
- 10 WHEREAS, this beloved individual exhibited extraordinary devotion to duty, outstanding
11 loyalty, fine leadership, and meticulous attention to detail in all his duties throughout his life;

- 13 WHEREAS, he was a classic southern gentleman and a person of magnanimous strengths
14 with an unimpeachable reputation for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness; and
- 15 WHEREAS, his unparalleled organizational and leadership talents, his remarkable patience
16 and diplomacy, his keen sense of vision, and his acute sensitivity to the needs of the citizens
17 of his community and state earned him the respect and admiration of his colleagues and
18 associates; and
- 19 WHEREAS, the tragic passing of this generous, kind, and devoted family man leaves an
20 unfillable void in the hearts and lives of his family and friends.

2 the members of this body express their deepest and most sincere regret at the passing of John
3 Cox.
