HOUSE SUBSTITUTE TO SENATE BILL 84

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to elections, and Title
2	40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, so as to
3	authorize the State Election Board to conduct certain voter education programs; to change
4	provisions relating to required presentation of identification by voters; to specify the types
5	of identification which may be used; to provide for Georgia voter identification cards to be
6	issued by each county board of registrars to persons who do not have a valid driver's license
7	or identification card issued by the Department of Driver Services; to provide for the contents
8	and appearance of such cards; to provide for applications and supporting documentation; to
9	provide for the supply of equipment and the adoption of rules and regulations by the State
10	Election Board; to change provisions relating to issuance of free identification cards by the
11	Department of Driver Services; to provide for other related matters; to provide an effective

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

- 15 Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to primaries and elections
- 16 generally, is amended by striking Code Section 21-2-31, relating to the duties of the State
- 17 Election Board, and inserting in lieu thereof a new Code Section 21-2-31 to read as follows:
- 18 "21-2-31.

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- 19 It shall be the duty of the State Election Board:
- 20 (1) To supervise and coordinate the work of the office of the Secretary of State,
- superintendents, registrars, deputy registrars, poll officers, and other officials so as to
- obtain uniformity in their practices and proceedings and legality and purity in all
- primaries and elections;
- 24 (2) To formulate, adopt, and promulgate such rules and regulations, consistent with law,
- as will be conducive to the fair, legal, and orderly conduct of primaries and elections;

and, upon the adoption of each rule and regulation, the board shall promptly file certified

- 2 copies thereof with the Secretary of State and each superintendent;
- 3 (3) To publish and furnish to primary and election officials, from time to time, a
- 4 sufficient number of indexed copies of all primary and election laws and pertinent rules
- 5 and regulations then in force;
- 6 (4) To publish and distribute such explanatory pamphlets regarding the interpretation and
- 7 application of primary and election laws as in the opinion of the board should be
- 8 distributed to the electorate;
- 9 (5) To investigate, or authorize the Secretary of State to investigate, when necessary or
- advisable the administration of primary and election laws and frauds and irregularities in
- primaries and elections and to report violations of the primary and election laws either
- 12 to the Attorney General or the appropriate district attorney who shall be responsible for
- further investigation and prosecution. Nothing in this paragraph shall be so construed as
- to require any complaining party to request an investigation by the board before such
- party might proceed to seek any other remedy available to that party under this chapter
- or any other provision of law;
- 17 (6) To make such recommendations to the General Assembly as it may deem advisable
- relative to the conduct and administration of primaries and elections;
- 19 (7) To promulgate rules and regulations to define uniform and nondiscriminatory
- standards concerning what constitutes a vote and what will be counted as a vote for each
- category of voting system used in this state;
- 22 (8) To employ such assistants as may be necessary; and
- 23 (9) Subject to funds being specifically appropriated by the General Assembly, to
- 24 <u>formulate and conduct a voter education program concerning voting procedures for</u>
- 25 voting by absentee ballot and at the polls with particular emphasis on the proper types of
- 26 <u>identification required for voting; and</u>
- 27 (10) To take such other action, consistent with law, as the board may determine to be
- conducive to the fair, legal, and orderly conduct of primaries and elections."
- SECTION 2.
- 30 Said title is further amended by striking Code Section 21-2-417, relating to presentation of
- 31 identification by voters, and inserting in its place new Code Sections 21-2-417 and
- 32 21-2-417.1 to read as follows:
- *"*21-2-417.
- 34 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this Code section, each elector shall present
- proper identification to a poll worker at or prior to completion of a voter's certificate at any

polling place and prior to such person's admission to the enclosed space at such polling

- 2 place. Proper identification shall consist of any one of the following:
- 3 (1) A Georgia driver's license which was properly issued by the appropriate state
- 4 agency;
- 5 (2) A <u>valid Georgia voter identification card issued under Code Section 21-2-417.1 or</u>
- 6 other valid identification card issued by a branch, department, agency, or entity of the
- 7 State of Georgia, any other state, or the United States authorized by law to issue personal
- 8 identification, provided that such identification card contains a photograph of the elector;
- 9 (3) A valid United States passport;
- 10 (4) A valid employee identification card containing a photograph of the elector and
- issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the United States government, this
- state, or any county, municipality, board, authority, or other entity of this state;
- 13 (5) A valid United States military identification card, provided that such identification
- card contains a photograph of the elector; or
- 15 (6) A valid tribal identification card containing a photograph of the elector.
- 16 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this Code section, if an elector is unable to
- produce any of the items of identification listed in subsection (a) of this Code section, he
- or she shall be allowed to vote a provisional ballot pursuant to Code Section 21-2-418 upon
- swearing or affirming that the elector is the person identified in the elector's voter
- certificate. Such provisional ballot shall only be counted if the registrars are able to verify
- 21 current and valid identification of the elector as provided in subsection (a) of this Code
- section within the time period for verifying provisional ballots pursuant to Code Section
- 23 21-2-419. Falsely swearing or affirming such statement under oath shall be punishable as
- a felony, and the penalty shall be distinctly set forth on the face of the statement.
- 25 (c) An elector who registered to vote by mail, but did not comply with subsection (c) of
- 26 Code Section 21-2-220, and who votes for the first time in this state shall present to the poll
- workers either one of the forms of identification listed in subsection (a) of this Code section
- or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other
- 29 government document that shows the name and address of such elector. If such elector
- does not have any of the forms of identification listed in this subsection, such elector may
- 31 vote a provisional ballot pursuant to Code Section 21-2-418 upon swearing or affirming
- that the elector is the person identified in the elector's voter certificate. Such provisional
- 33 ballot shall only be counted if the registrars are able to verify current and valid
- 34 identification of the elector as provided in this subsection within the time period for
- verifying provisional ballots pursuant to Code Section 21-2-419. Falsely swearing or
- affirming such statement under oath shall be punishable as a felony, and the penalty shall
- be distinctly set forth on the face of the statement.

- 1 <u>21-2-417.1.</u>
- 2 (a) Each county board of registrars shall provide at least one place in the county at which
- 3 <u>it shall accept applications for and issue Georgia voter identification cards which shall</u>
- 4 <u>under state law be valid only for purposes of voter identification under Code Section</u>
- 5 21-2-417. No fee shall be charged or collected for the application for or issuance of a
- 6 Georgia voter identification card.
- 7 (b) No person shall be eligible for a Georgia voter identification card if such person has
- 8 <u>a valid unexpired driver's license or identification card issued under Code Section</u>
- 9 40-5-100.
- 10 (c) The Georgia voter identification card shall be captioned 'GEORGIA VOTER
- 11 <u>IDENTIFICATION CARD' and shall contain a prominent statement that under Georgia</u>
- 12 <u>law it is valid only as identification for voting purposes. The Georgia voter identification</u>
- card shall be laminated, shall contain a digital color photograph of the applicant, and shall
- include the following information:
- 15 (1) Full legal name;
- 16 (2) Address of residence;
- 17 <u>(3) Birth date;</u>
- 18 (4) Date identification card was issued;
- 19 <u>(5) Sex;</u>
- 20 <u>(6) Height;</u>
- 21 <u>(7) Weight;</u>
- 22 <u>(8) Eye color;</u>
- 23 (9) County where the identification card was issued including a county number to be
- 24 <u>assigned for each county by the Secretary of State; and</u>
- 25 (10) Such other information or identification as required by rule of the State Election
- Board.
- 27 (d) The application for a Georgia voter identification card shall elicit the information
- 28 required under subsection (c) of this Code section and such other information as may be
- 29 <u>required by rule of the State Election Board. The application shall be signed and sworn to</u>
- 30 by the applicant and any falsification or fraud in the making of the application shall
- 31 <u>constitute a felony offense under Code Section 16-10-71, relating to the offense of false</u>
- 32 swearing.
- 33 (e) The board of registrars shall require presentation and verification of the following
- 34 <u>information before issuing a Georgia voter identification card to a person:</u>
- 35 (1) A photo identity document, except that a nonphoto identity document is acceptable
- if it includes both the person's full legal name and date of birth;
- 37 (2) Documentation showing the person's date of birth;

- 1 (3) Proof of the person's social security account number; and
- 2 (4) Documentation showing the person's name and address of principal residence.
- 3 (f) A Georgia voter identification card shall remain valid so long as a person resides at the
- 4 <u>same address and remains qualified to vote. It shall be the duty of a person who moves his</u>
- 5 or her residence within the State of Georgia to surrender his or her card to the board of
- 6 registrars of the county of his or her new residence; and such person may after such
- 7 <u>surrender apply for and receive a new card if such person is otherwise eligible under this</u>
- 8 Code section. It shall be the duty of a person who moves his or her residence outside the
- 9 State of Georgia or who ceases to be qualified to vote to surrender his or her card to the
- board of registrars by which it was issued.
- 11 (g) The State Election Board shall provide each county board of registrars with the
- 12 <u>necessary equipment, forms, supplies, and training for the production of the Georgia voter</u>
- identification cards and shall maintain such equipment.
- 14 (h) The State Election Board shall adopt rules and regulations for the administration of this
- 15 Code section and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, such rules and
- 16 <u>regulations may further define or prescribe the types of documentation required under</u>
- subsection (e) of this Code section."

SECTION 3.

- 19 Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is
- amended in Code Section 40-5-103, relating to fees for personal identification cards for
- 21 persons without driver's licenses, by striking subsection (d) and inserting in its place a new
- 22 subsection to read as follows:
- 23 "(d) The department shall not be authorized to collect a fee for an identification card from
- 24 any person:
- 25 (1) Who swears under oath that he or she is indigent and cannot pay the fee for an
- 26 identification card, that he or she desires an identification card in order to vote in a
- primary or election in Georgia, and that he or she does not have any other form of
- 28 identification that is acceptable under Code Section 21-2-417 for identification at the
- polls in order to vote; and
- 30 (2) Who produces evidence that he or she is registered to vote in Georgia.
- 31 This subsection shall not apply to a person who has been issued a driver's license in this
- 32 state."
- 33 SECTION 4.
- 34 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 35 without such approval.
