## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Remembering and honoring the life of Ms. Martha Talbot Eaves; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Ms. Martha Talbot Eaves was born in Atlanta on January 16, 1917, to William  
3 Flournoy Helms and Maude Hauser Talbot; and
- 4 WHEREAS, a smart, talented, and determined lady, Ms. Eaves graduated from Commercial  
5 and Girls High School in 1934, and in 1969 earned a degree in English literature from  
6 Georgia State University while working full time and raising her three children as a single  
7 mother; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Ms. Eaves dedicated the last 25 years of her life to advocating for Georgia's  
9 seniors, serving on numerous councils, committees, and task forces, including serving as  
10 chairperson of the Georgia Council on Aging, as a member of the Long-term Care Study  
11 Commission and Senate Elder Abuse Task Force, and as a delegate for Georgia to the White  
12 House Conference on Aging in 1995; and
- 13 WHEREAS, a proud liberal Democrat, Ms. Eaves never backed away from addressing the  
14 problems facing our society, and she courageously spoke on behalf of the millions of seniors  
15 without adequate health care; and
- 16 WHEREAS, her years of advocacy on behalf of senior citizens earned her the respect of  
17 others of all political affiliations, and she was the recipient of several honors, including the  
18 2003 Tom Murphy State Service Award for Human Service and Health Care, the 2004  
19 National Committee to Preserve Social Security and Medicare Salute to Leaders in Aging  
20 Award, and the 2005 Georgia Commission on Women Georgia Legacy - Older Women,  
21 among many others; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Ms. Eaves always lived life to the fullest, and her family and friends will always  
23 remember her brave, compassionate, and independent spirit; and

1 WHEREAS, Georgia lost a most estimable citizen on August 13, 2005, with the passing of  
2 Ms. Martha Talbot Eaves.

3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
4 the members of this body join together to express their deepest regret at the passing of Ms.  
5 Martha Talbot Eaves and extend their most sincere condolences to her family and friends.
