A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending John Matthew Vaughan; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, John Matthew Vaughan of Troop 94, Woodstock, Georgia, has attained the rank
3 of Eagle Scout, the most distinguished rank conferred by the Boy Scouts of America; and
- 4 WHEREAS, a candidate for the most exceptional award in scouting must complete a
5 rigorous program of training and demonstrate his proficiency in selected scouting techniques
6 and attainment of the highest ideals of scouting; and

14 actions of young people, it is abundantly fitting and proper for this body to recognize with
15 particularity the outstanding accomplishments of this extraordinary individual.

17 commend John Matthew Vaughan for his diligence and dedication in pursuing the highest
18 honor awarded by the Boy Scouts of America and congratulate him on attaining the
