## A RESOLUTION

1 Remembering and honoring the life of Lieutenant Colonel Gregory J. Muller; and for other  
2 purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Colonel Gregory J. Muller was born to Thomas M. Muller, Sr., and  
4 Barbara Mickler Muller on November 25, 1960, in Savannah, Georgia; and

5 WHEREAS, a graduate of Benedictine Military School and Georgia Southern University  
6 with a degree in Electronic Engineering Technology, Lt. Col. Muller was the Supervisory  
7 Control and Data Acquisition Coordinator for the City of Savannah; and

8 WHEREAS, Lt. Col. Muller honorably served his country as a member of the United States  
9 Military for 24 years, 19 of which he served with the 165th Airlift Wing of the Georgia Air  
10 National Guard; and

11 WHEREAS, Lt. Col. Muller valiantly completed two tours of duty during Operations  
12 Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom, and since 2003, flew 210 combat sorties and earned  
13 an Air Force Medal; and

14 WHEREAS, an active and greatly respected member of the Savannah community, Lt. Col.  
15 Muller was a parishioner at St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church and a member of the Irish  
16 Heritage Society, Knights of Columbus, and the St. Patrick's Day Parade Committee; and

17 WHEREAS, he was a devoted family man who was active in the Boy Scouts, soccer, and  
18 other activities with his son; and

19 WHEREAS, Lt. Col. Muller leaves behind a loving family, including his wife, Jacqueline  
20 A. Muller; his son, Jack Muller; his father, Thomas M. Muller, Sr.; his brothers and  
21 sister-in-law, Thomas M. Muller, Jr., and Cindy Muller, Steven C. Muller, Paul A. Muller,

1 Patrick F. Muller, and Eddie Muller; his niece and nephew, Jennifer Muller and Michael  
2 Muller; and his grandmother, Louise Kistler; and

3 WHEREAS, Georgia lost a most estimable citizen on November 27, 2005, with the passing  
4 of Lieutenant Colonel Gregory J. Muller.

5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
