

House Resolution 1201

A RESOLUTION

1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to authorize the General Assembly to
 2 provide for dedication of certain revenue derived from fees from the sale of specially
 3 designed license plates commemorating the Sons of Confederate Veterans; to provide for
 4 related matters; to provide for submission of this amendment for ratification or rejection; and
 5 for other purposes.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI of the Constitution is amended by adding at the end
 9 thereof a new subparagraph (n) to read as follows:

10 "(n) The General Assembly may provide by law for dedication of certain revenue derived
 11 from fees from the sale of special and distinctive license plates commemorating the Sons
 12 of Confederate Veterans. The General Assembly may provide by law for all matters
 13 necessary or appropriate to the implementation of this subparagraph."

14 **SECTION 2.**

15 The above proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be published and submitted as
 16 provided in Article X, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution. The ballot submitting the
 17 above proposed amendment shall have written or printed thereon the following:

18 "() YES Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to authorize the General
 19 Assembly to provide for dedication of certain revenue derived from fees
 20 () NO from the sale of special and distinctive license plates commemorating the
 21 Sons of Confederate Veterans?"

22 All persons desiring to vote in favor of ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "Yes."
 23 All persons desiring to vote against ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "No." If
 24 such amendment shall be ratified as provided in said Paragraph of the Constitution, it shall
 25 become a part of the Constitution of this state.
