- 4 WHEREAS, numbering over 350 members and led by Director Charles E. Todd II, the  
5 Georgia Bridgemen are committed to entertaining their audiences with the highest caliber of  
6 dedication, creativity, and musicianship; and
- 7 WHEREAS, among their countless performances across the nation, the Georgia Bridgemen  
8 played in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City in 2003 and at the  
9 Presidential Inaugural Parade in Washington, D.C., in 2005; and
- 10 WHEREAS, this year, the Georgia Bridgemen participated at the Tournament of Roses  
11 Parade in Pasadena, California, where they gave a memorable performance amid steady rain  
12 as the lead band for the NBC portion of the parade; and

14 recording a CD in 2004, *Quiet Screams*, and performing at events throughout the state; and
- 15 WHEREAS, with a perpetual dedication to their craft and an unwavering commitment to  
16 excellence, the Georgia Bridgemen bring great honor to their school, community, and state.
