A RESOLUTION

- 1 Remembering and honoring the life of Mr. U. H. Pittman, Jr.; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Mr. U. H. Pittman, Jr., of Martinez, Georgia, was born in Lancaster, South
3 Carolina, on October 27, 1927; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Mr. Pittman honorably served his country as a member of the United States
5 Navy during World War II and was employed with Georgia Iron Works for 39 years; and
- 6 WHEREAS, always doing all he could to make his community a better place, Mr. Pittman
7 was a cofounder of the Martinez Fire Department; and
- 8 WHEREAS, from 1976 to 1980, he served with distinction on the Columbia County Board
9 of Commissioners, where he was known for his leadership and vision; and
- 10 WHEREAS, a devout Christian, Mr. Pittman was one of the 17 people who established the
11 Martinez Baptist Church; he was also very active in many charitable causes, such as the
12 Easter Seals, the American Cancer Society, and the American Heart Association, and was
13 the campaign director for the March of Dimes; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Mr. Pittman leaves behind a loving and devoted family, including his wife of
15 55 years, Marian S. Pittman; his daughter and son-in-law, Kathy and Larry Price; his sons
16 and daughters-in-law, Bill and Judy Sarver, Ricky and Peggy Pittman, and Monty Pittman;
17 his five grandchildren, Beth Heath, Larry A. Price, Jr., Emiley Sarver, Katie Sarver, and
18 Evan Pittman; and two great-grandchildren, Karly and Caroline; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Georgia lost a most estimable citizen and community leader on March 26, 2005,
20 with the passing of Mr. Pittman.

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
2 GEORGIA that the members of this body join together to express their deepest regret at the
3 passing of Mr. U. H. Pittman, Jr., and extend their most sincere condolences to his family.
