A RESOLUTION

1 Commending the Clayton County Juvenile Court on receiving the American Probation and
2 Parole Association's President's Award for Best Practices; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the Clayton County Juvenile Court has received the American Probation and
4 Parole Association's President's Award for Best Practices in recognition of its outstanding
5 efforts to reduce recidivism among juvenile offenders; and

6 WHEREAS, this prestigious award is given annually to honor a jurisdiction that has
7 developed proven practices that reduce recidivism and promote rehabilitation; and

8 WHEREAS, Clayton County Juvenile Court's FAST-START Program has reduced the
9 repeat offense rate of juvenile probationers by 50 percent since 2003; and

10 WHEREAS, this comprehensive program aims to target offenders at high risk for recidivism
11 and to focus resources and supervision on youth who are most prone to commit serious
12 crimes; and

13 WHEREAS, in further recognition of the court's inspirational success, Judges Steve Teske,
14 K. Van Banke, and Tracy Graham were invited to present a workshop on the Clayton County
15 Juvenile Court's innovative approaches to reducing recidivism among juvenile probationers;

17 WHEREAS, all Georgians owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to the Clayton County
18 Juvenile Court, whose laudable work has helped to secure a brighter future for many of our
19 state's most troubled youth.

20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
21 the members of this body join in commending the Clayton County Juvenile Court on
