A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Reverend Joseph Everhart Boone, a civil rights legend; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, premier clergyman and civil rights activist Reverend Joseph Everhart Boone
- 3 has a career that has spanned nearly four decades, reaching out to transform thousands of
- 4 African American lives by carrying the message of economic dignity from the pulpit, through
- 5 the streets, and to the boardrooms of America; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Reverend Boone has been a man of uncommon vision, charged and driven by
- 7 formidable dedication carrying forth with unflagging courage his conviction that each citizen
- 8 has the right to dignified participation in the American economy's mainstream, both as
- 9 producers and consumers; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Reverend Boone's miraculous achievements thus far in his lifetime include
- serving as Chief Negotiator for Operation Breadbasket, the economic arm of the Southern
- 12 Christian Leadership Conference; presiding as Pastor at Rush Memorial Congregational
- 13 Church in Atlanta, the meeting and organizational base for the Student Non-Violent Civil
- 14 Rights movement, and at the First Congregational Church in Alabama, where he organized
- 15 the first "Selective Buying Campaign" in Alabama; acting as Director of the Metropolitan
- 16 Atlanta Summit Leadership Congress, Inc., during which time he was designated by Mrs.
- 17 Coretta Scott King to coordinate the first leg of the "Poor People's Campaign"; leading the
- 18 P.J. Woods Center for the Blind as its director, coordinating programs including a 24 hour
- 19 residential treatment facility; and persuading the FCC as the cochairperson of Atlanta
- 20 Against Unfairness in Broadcasting to condition license renewals for all major television and
- 21 radio companies on providing credible programming which is relative to the needs of black
- 22 people in Georgia; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Reverend Boone's career in public service has earned him a distinguished series
- 24 of honors and awards, including "Civic Leader of the Year" in 1959 from the First
- 25 Congregational Church in Anniston, Alabama; "The Young Man of the Year in Religion" in

1 1964 from the Atlanta International Chapter of the Wise Men; The Excelsior Knights

- 2 Citizenship Award in 1967; an appointment by Governor Jimmy Carter to the Governor's
- 3 Council on Human Relations in 1971; WGUN's Outstanding Citizen Radio Award in 1971;
- 4 "Civil Rights Fighter of the Year" in 1975 from the Bronner Brothers; and the "Civil Rights
- 5 Award" in 1991 from Clark Atlanta University.
- 6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 7 the members of this body commend civil rights legend Reverend Joseph Everhart Boone for
- 8 his outstanding leadership and exemplary public service to his community and this state.
- 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 10 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Reverend Joseph Everhart
