A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 11 of Chapter 1 of Title 7 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to records and reports of currency transactions, so as to provide for an illegal
- 3 immigrant fee with respect to money received for wire transmission; to provide for a short
- 4 title; to provide for procedures, conditions, and limitations; to provide for exceptions; to
- 5 provide for legislative intent; to prohibit certain conduct to avoid or evade such fee; to
- provide for criminal penalties; to provide for powers, duties, and authority of the 6
- commissioner of banking and finance with respect to the foregoing; to provide an effective 7
- date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes. 8

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

10 **SECTION 1.**

- 11 Article 11 of Chapter 1 of Title 7 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 12 records and reports of currency transactions, is amended by adding a new Code section
- immediately following Code Section 7-1-912, to be designated Code Section 7-1-912.1, to 13
- 14 read as follows:
- "7-1-912.1. 15

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- (a) This Code section shall be known and may be cited as the 'Illegal Immigrant Fee Act.' 16
- (b) Any authorized agent of a licensee or any money transmission business which is 17
- 18 subject to licensure under Article 4 of this chapter and which receives money for wire
- 19 transmission shall collect from the customer a fee in the amount of 5 percent of the amount
- 20 of money being transmitted. Such fee shall not apply to any such transaction upon the
- customer providing adequate proof of United States citizenship or adequate proof that the 22 customer is legally present in the United States. Such proof shall consist only of valid
- identification documentation included on the list of acceptable documents of Employment 23
- Eligibility Verification Form I-9 of the federal Department of Homeland Security as proof 24
- of lawful presence in the United States or providing that customer provides proof that 25
- 26 he/she is paying taxes within this state by providing a current pay stub showing customer

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1 name and taxes withheld or current state or federal tax return. Any identification document

- 2 issued by a foreign government or a driver's license or identification card issued by any
- 3 state which, on or after July 1, 2006, authorized such driver's license or identification card
- 4 to be issued to persons not lawfully present in the United States shall not be accepted as
- 5 evidence of lawful presence in the United States.
- 6 (c) The money transmission business shall give the customer a receipt setting forth:
- 7 (1) The date of receipt of the money;
- 8 (2) The amount of the fee, if applicable; and
- 9 (3) The amount of the money in dollars and cents.
- 10 (d) Subject to the general appropriations process, it is the intent of the General Assembly
- that an amount equal to the amount of funds derived from the fees collected under this
- 12 Code section shall be utilized for indigent care programs.
- 13 (e) It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly and willfully transmit money on
- behalf of any person in order to avoid or evade the fee required under this Code section.
- Any person who violates this subsection shall, upon conviction thereof for a first offense,
- be guilty of a misdemeanor; for a second or subsequent offense, such person shall, upon
- 17 conviction thereof, be guilty of a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature.
- 18 (f) The commissioner shall provide by rule or regulation for the implementation of this
- 19 Code section including, but not limited to, any appropriate administrative actions or fines
- 20 for knowing and willful violations of this Code section."
- 21 SECTION 2.
- 22 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 23 without such approval.
- SECTION 3.
- 25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
