A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 9 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 prevention and control of air pollution, so as to prohibit certain acts relating to gasoline
- 3 containing certain chemicals; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 5 SECTION 1.
- 6 Chapter 9 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to prevention and
- 7 control of air pollution, is amended by adding a new Article to read as follows:
- 8 "ARTICLE 3.
- 9 12-9-70.
- 10 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 11 (1) 'DIPE' means diisopropyl ether.
- 12 (2) 'ETBE' means ethyl tertiary butyl ether.
- 13 (3) 'MTBE' means methyl tertiary butyl ether.
- 14 (4) 'TAME' means tertiary amyl methyl ether.
- 15 (b) On and after January 1, 2008, it shall be unlawful to knowingly manufacture, blend,
- or store for distribution in this state any gasoline containing:
- 17 (1) MTBE;
- 18 (2) Methanol;
- 19 (3) Isopropanol;
- 20 (4) n-Propanol;
- 21 (5) n-Butanol;
- 22 (6) Iso-Butanol;
- 23 (7) Sec-Butanol;
- 24 (8) Tert-Butanol (tert-amyl alcohol);

- 1 (9) Tert-petanol;
- 2 (10) ETBE;
- 3 (11) DIPE; or
- 4 (12) TAME.
- 5 (c) The board shall adopt rules and regulations to provide for a phase out of the
- 6 permissible use of gasoline containing chemicals specified in subsection (b) of this Code
- section during the period between July 1, 2006, and January 1, 2008, in a manner designed
- 8 to coordinate such phase out with other states adjacent to this state to the extent
- 9 practicable."

10 SECTION 2.

11 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
