- 2 WHEREAS, seventy years ago a legacy was born when James Melton Isom came into this
- 3 world, welcomed into the arms of the late Reverend Johnnie Isom, Sr., and Lora Lee Smith
- 4 Isom; and
- 5 WHEREAS, when James Melton Isom was one of the first babies to be publicly blessed at
- 6 the First African Missionary Baptist Church in Baxley, the minister asked in his blessing
- 7 prayer if God would bestow upon James a long life and great talent; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Mr. Isom is living proof that God does answer prayers as he began playing on
- 9 the piano at the tender age of four all of the songs he heard in Sunday School while his feet
- 10 dangled from the stool; and
- 11 WHEREAS, he became a prodigy in his home town and started playing and singing with his
- brother Isaiah and sister Eleanor at the local hotel songs such as, "My Mind is Made Up and
- 13 My Heart is Fixed," "I'm Going All the Way with the Lord," and "Jesus Wants Me to be a
- 14 Sunbeam"; and
- WHEREAS, as a teenager, he was a star athlete of the basketball team, being sure to attend
- 16 the prayer meetings on Tuesday nights before going to the game; and
- 17 WHEREAS, at this time in his life, Mr. Isom was playing for local churches, learning music
- 18 from a local musician, and traveling to Ft. Valley State College to learn music from the late
- 19 Mr. William Moore; and
- 20 WHEREAS, he attended Ft. Valley State College where he majored in music, minored in the
- 21 beautiful Agnes Ransby, was elected "Gentleman of the Year," and won the hearts of the late

- 3 WHEREAS, Mr. Isom began teaching in Thomson in 1959 at McDuffie County Training
- 4 School, later renamed R.L. Norris High School, where his days as school musician were
- 5 filled with many honors for his choral and ensemble presentations, both locally and
- 6 statewide; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the R.L. Norris Chorus was always a winner in competition under Mr. Isom's
- 8 direction; and
- 9 WHEREAS, in 1991, when he retired from the McDuffie County School System, he found
- 10 that he was not yet ready to be completely retired and, therefore, began teaching in the
- 11 Warren County School System; and
- WHEREAS, he has been invited on several occasions to lend his voice to Handel's Messiah
- 13 presentations at the First Baptist Church in Thomson, Georgia; to render music for special
- occasions throughout the community and across the state; and to do choir workshops; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Mr. Isom has dedicated himself to Springfield Baptist Church; and
- 16 WHEREAS, his untiring dedication to the music ministry has been a tremendous inspiration
- 17 to the church and the community; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Mr. Isom actively participates in the Georgia General Missionary Baptist
- 19 Convention, Fourth Shiloh Convention, and others too numerous to list, in addition to being
- an inspirational Sunday School teacher in the youth department; and
- 21 WHEREAS, a strong family man, he and his college minor, Agnes Ransby, have been
- 22 blessed with two wonderful sons, who themselves are strong family men; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Mr. Isom has a deep respect for his home and family and he truly loves God;

- 25 WHEREAS, as a man, musician, minister of music, and deacon, James Melton Isom has
- 26 always found peace and inspiration in music; it seems that it is in his bones as he even walks
- with rhythm.
