A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 5 of Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to wild
- 2 animals, so as to prohibit the importation of live cervids into this state; to prohibit the
- 3 importation or possession of certain whole cervid carcasses or cervid carcass parts; to define
- 4 certain terms; to provide penalties for violations; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 5 of Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to wild animals, is
- 9 amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 10 "27-5-2.1.
- 11 (a) As used in this Code section, the term,
- 12 (1) 'Cervid' means a member of the family cervidae.
- 13 (2) 'Chronic wasting disease' means a fatal disease that belongs to a group of diseases
- known as transmissible spongiform encephalopathies and that affects the brains of
- cervids.
- 16 (3) 'Clean' means having no meat matter or tissue attached to the carcass part.
- 17 (4) 'Importation' means the transportation of a cervid, cervid carcass, or carcass part into
- this state.
- 19 (5) 'Whole' means the entire carcass, whether eviscerated or not, prior to the carcass
- being processed.
- 21 (b)(1) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, partnership, or association to import,
- bring, or cause to be imported or brought into this state any live cervid.
- 23 (2)(A) Any person who violates paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be guilty of a
- 24 misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature and upon conviction shall be punished
- by a fine of not less than \$1,500.00 nor more than \$5,000.00, imprisonment for a period
- not exceeding 12 months, or both such fine and imprisonment.

1 (B) The hunting and fishing privileges of any person convicted of violating paragraph

- 2 (1) of this subsection shall be suspended for not less than three years from the date of
- 3 conviction.
- 4 (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to import or possess a whole cervid carcass or
- 5 cervid carcass part from any state having a documented case of a cervid infected with
- 6 chronic wasting disease, except for any one or more of the following cervid carcass parts:
- 7 (1) Boned-out meat and commercially processed cuts of meat;
- 8 (2) Portions of meat with no part of the spinal column or head attached;
- 9 (3) Hides with no heads attached;
- 10 (4) Clean skull plates with antlers attached;
- 11 (5) Clean antlers;
- 12 (6) Finished taxidermy heads; and
- 13 (7) Clean upper canine teeth (buglers, whistlers, ivories)."

14 SECTION 2.

15 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
