A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Ms. Nanon G. Wiles on the occasion of her retirement; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Ms. Nanon G. Wiles has served the Georgia Department of Corrections with
3 faithfulness and distinction for 34 years; and
- 4 WHEREAS, she began her career as a probation officer in the Macon Probation Office on
5 December 1, 1973, and was promoted to become the first female superintendent of a male
6 facility, the Macon Diversion Center, in 1975; and
- 7 WHEREAS, from 1976 to 1979, Ms. Wiles served as District Correctional Psychologist of
8 the Southwest District and served as Coordinator of the Pre-sentence Assessment Program
9 for Probation from November, 1979, to July, 1983; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Ms. Wiles has been an outstanding representative for the Department of
11 Corrections, serving as Legislative Liaison for Probation during the 1981 and 1982
12 legislative sessions; after being promoted to the Commissioner's Office in July, 1983, she
13 served as Legislative Liaison for the Department of Corrections until 1988; and
- 14 WHEREAS, she served as executive assistant to Commissioner David Evans and held the
15 positions of Director of Board and Information Services and Liaison to the Board of
16 Corrections under Commissioners David Evans, Bobby Whitworth, and Alan Alt from 1989
17 to 1994 before being appointed as Director of Counseling Services in 1994; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Ms. Wiles transferred to the Marietta Probation Office as a probation officer
19 in 1996, where she was promoted to probation officer III in 1998, before moving to the
20 Enotah Judicial Circuit in September, 2000, where she currently serves as manager of the
21 Blairsville Probation Office; and

1 WHEREAS, on March 31, 2006, Ms. Wiles will be retiring after over three decades of
2 service to Georgia, and all her friends and colleagues at the Department of Corrections will
3 greatly miss this outstanding professional; and

4 WHEREAS, Ms. Wiles's long and illustrious career has been marked by the highest caliber
5 of integrity and dedication to excellence, and it is abundantly fitting and proper for this body
6 to appropriately recognize this extraordinary lady on this very special milestone.

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
8 the members of this body join in commending Ms. Nanon G. Wiles on 34 years of exemplary
9 service to the Georgia Department of Corrections and extend their best wishes on a happy
