House Bill 1122 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend an Act providing for a homestead exemption from Peach County School District
- 2 ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$20,000.00 of the assessed value
- 3 of the homestead for certain residents of that school district whose annual income does not
- 4 exceed \$20,000.00 and who are 65 years of age or older or disabled, approved April 1, 1995
- 5 (Ga. L. 1995, p. 4181), so as to increase the amount of such exemption and the income cap
- 6 applicable to such exemption; to provide for applicability; to provide for a referendum,
- 7 effective dates, and automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

- 10 An Act providing for a homestead exemption from Peach County School District ad valorem
- 11 taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$20,000.00 of the assessed value of the
- 12 homestead for certain residents of that school district whose annual income does not exceed
- 13 \$20,000.00 and who are 65 years of age or older or disabled, approved April 1, 1995 (Ga. L.
- 14 1995, p. 4181), is amended by striking subsection (a) of Section 2 and inserting in its place
- 15 a new subsection (a) to read as follows:

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- 16 "(a) Each resident of the Peach County School District who is a senior citizen or who is
- disabled is granted an exemption on that person's homestead from all Peach County School
- District ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$30,000.00 of the
- assessed value of that homestead, if that person's income, together with the income of the
- spouse of such person who resides within such homestead, does not exceed \$30,000.00 for
- 21 the immediately preceding taxable year. The value of that property in excess of such
- 22 exempted amount shall remain subject to taxation."
- SECTION 2.
- 24 Unless prohibited by the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, the election
- 25 superintendent of Peach County shall call and conduct an election as provided in this section

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1 for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Peach County School District for

- 2 approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that election on the date of
- 3 the November, 2006, state-wide general election and shall issue the call and conduct that
- 4 election as provided by general law. The election superintendent shall cause the date and
- 5 purpose of the election to be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding
- 6 the date thereof in the official organ of Peach County. The ballot shall have written or
- 7 printed thereon the words:
- 8 "() YES Shall the Act be approved which changes the homestead exemption from
- 9 Peach County School District ad valorem taxes for educational purposes for
- 10 () NO senior citizens and disabled persons by increasing the amount of the
- exemption to \$30,000.00 and which increases the income cap of such exemption to \$30,000.00?"
- 12 All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and all persons desiring
- 13 to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes cast on
- such question are for approval of the Act, Section 1 of this Act shall become of full force and
- 15 effect on January 1, 2007. If the Act is not so approved or if the election is not conducted
- as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act shall not become effective and this Act shall
- 17 be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following that election
- date. The expense of such election shall be borne by Peach County. It shall be the election
- superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State.
- 20 SECTION 3.
- 21 Except as otherwise provided in Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon
- 22 its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
- SECTION 4.
- 24 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
