**A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT**

1 To amend Part 2 of Article 15 of Chapter 1 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia
2 Annotated, relating to fair business practices, so as to prohibit the use or display of social
3 security numbers except in specified circumstances; to provide for related matters; to provide
4 for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:**

6 **SECTION 1.**

7 Part 2 of Article 15 of Chapter 1 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
8 relating to fair business practices, is amended by inserting a new Code Section 10-1-393.8,
9 immediately following Code Section 10-1-393.7, relating to solicitations during final illness,
10 to read as follows:

11 "10-1-393.8.

12 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Code section, a person, firm, or corporation shall
13 not:

14 (1) Publicly post or publicly display in any manner an individual's social security
15 number. As used in this Code section, 'publicly post' or 'publicly display' means to
16 intentionally communicate or otherwise make available to the general public;

17 (2) Require an individual to transmit his or her social security number over the Internet,
18 unless the connection is secure or the social security number is encrypted; or

19 (3) Require an individual to use his or her social security number to access an Internet
20 website, unless a password or unique personal identification number or other
21 authentication device is also required to access the Internet website.

22 (b) This Code section shall not apply to:

23 (1) The collection, release, or use of an individual's social security number as required
24 by state or federal law;

25 (2) The inclusion of an individual's social security number in an application, form, or
26 document sent by mail, electronically transmitted, or transmitted by facsimile:

- 1 (A) As part of an application or enrollment process;
- 2 (B) To establish, amend, or terminate an account, contract, or policy; or
- 3 (C) To confirm the accuracy of the individual's social security number;
- 4 (3) The use of an individual's social security number for internal verification or
- 5 administrative purposes; or
- 6 (4) An interactive computer service provider's or a telecommunications provider's
- 7 transmission or routing of, or intermediate temporary storage or caching of, an
- 8 individual's social security number.
- 9 (c) This Code section shall not impose a duty on an interactive computer service provider
- 10 or a telecommunications provider actively to monitor its service or to affirmatively seek
- 11 evidence of the transmission of social security numbers on its service.
- 12 (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of this Code section, the clerks of superior court of this
- 13 state shall be held harmless for filing, publicly posting, or publicly displaying any
- 14 document containing an individual's social security number that the clerk is otherwise
- 15 required by law to file, publicly post, or publicly display for public inspection."

SECTION 2.

17 It shall be unlawful for any person in the state legally or illegally to knowingly use a false,

18 altered, stolen or illegally manufactured Social Security card for purposes of gaining

19 employment or registration of an automobile. In addition to federal law a person committing

20 the above offense who is in this state illegally shall be guilty of a felony punishable by not

21 less than 10 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine.

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SECTION 3.

23 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2006.

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SECTION 4.

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
