

## Senate Resolution 1201

## A RESOLUTION

1 Commending the Together Rx Access Card program and its participating pharmaceutical  
2 companies; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, more than 1.38 million Georgians, 20 percent of the state's non-elderly  
4 population, do not have health insurance, including 13 percent of the state's children; and

5 WHEREAS, unless they have the resources to pay for staggeringly expensive treatments out  
6 of their own pockets, uninsured individuals have limited access to proper health care; and

7 WHEREAS, all Georgians deserve access to the medications they need in order to care for  
8 their health; and

9 WHEREAS, in January 2005, the Together Rx Access Card program was launched by ten  
10 pharmaceutical companies to help low-income, uninsured individuals and families gain  
11 access to prescription medications and products at savings of 25 to 40 percent; and

12 WHEREAS, this free, easy-to-use program is offered by the following pharmaceutical  
13 companies: Novartis, GlaxoSmithKline, Abbott Laboratories, AstraZeneca, Bristol-Myers  
14 Squibb Company, Johnson & Johnson, Pfizer, sanofi-aventis Group, Takeda, and TAP  
15 Pharmaceutical Products, Inc.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
17 join together to commend the Together Rx Access Card program and its participating  
18 pharmaceutical companies for their efforts to help uninsured Georgia residents gain greater  
19 access to prescription products.

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed  
21 to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to the above-named pharmaceutical  
22 companies that participate in the Together Rx Access Card program.
