## A RESOLUTION

1 Commending Taiwan on its contributions to the global economy, the promotion of world  
2 peace, freedom, and human rights and supporting its efforts to join the World Health  
3 Organization, the United Nations, and other international organizations as well as efforts to  
4 enter into a free trade agreement with the United States; and for other purposes.

5 WHEREAS, Taiwan and the United States of America are long standing friends and allies,  
6 both cherishing the commonly shared values of freedom, democracy, and human rights; and

7 WHEREAS, Taiwan is the world's 16th largest economy, America's 8th largest trading  
8 partner, and the 5th largest market for U. S. agricultural products; and

9 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia and Taiwan have enjoyed stable and mutually beneficial  
10 sister-state relations since 1984 with a prospect of further growth; and

11 WHEREAS, Taiwan was Georgia's 11th largest export market in 2005, reaching \$400.7  
12 million; and

13 WHEREAS, the state of Georgia supports a free trade agreement between the United States  
14 and Taiwan; and

15 WHEREAS, Taiwan is a leading manufacturer of information technology products and an  
16 indispensable provider for the global high-tech industry; and

17 WHEREAS, Taiwan's peace and stability are not only vital to the Asian Pacific region but  
18 to the world economy; and

19 WHEREAS, any threat of the use of force against Taiwan which may cause tension in the  
20 region should be strongly opposed; and

1 WHEREAS, Taiwan is a willing and contributing member of the world community and is  
2 one of the most active foreign contributors in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina and other  
3 natural disasters in 2005; and

4 WHEREAS, the 23 million free citizens of Taiwan are not represented in the United Nations,  
5 the World Health Organization, and other important international organizations, hindering  
6 the fundamental human rights of the Taiwanese people; and

7 WHEREAS, it is imperative for Taiwan to participate in the activities of the World Health  
8 Organization for the sake of global health, particularly in light of threatening epidemic  
9 diseases such as SARS, bird flu, and others.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
11 this body commends and supports the efforts of the Republic of China (Taiwan) to join the  
12 United Nations, the World Health Organization, and other international organizations as well  
13 as its efforts to join in a free trade agreement with the United States.

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
15 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Mr. R. C. Wu, Director  
16 General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Atlanta.
