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House Bill 1524 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To provide a homestead exemption from Banks County school district ad valorem taxes for
- 2 educational purposes in the amount of \$20,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for
- 3 residents of that school district who are 62 years of age or over and whose income, excluding
- 4 certain retirement income, does not exceed \$10,000.00; to provide for definitions; to specify
- 5 the terms and conditions of the exemption and the procedures relating thereto; to provide for
- 6 applicability; to provide for a referendum, effective dates, and automatic repeal; to repeal
- 7 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

10 (a) As used in this Act, the term:

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- 11 (1) "Ad valorem taxes for educational purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for
- educational purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of the Banks County school district,
- including, but not limited to, ad valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire county
- school district bonded indebtedness.
- 15 (2) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of
- the O.C.G.A., as amended.
- 17 (3) "Income" means Georgia taxable net income determined pursuant to Chapter 7 of
- Title 48 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, for state income tax purposes, except income shall
- 19 not include income received as retirement, survivor, or disability benefits under the
- federal Social Security Act or under any other public or private retirement, disability, or
- 21 pension system, except such income which is in excess of the maximum amount
- authorized to be paid to an individual and such individual's spouse under the federal
- Social Security Act. Income from such sources in excess of such maximum amount shall
- be included as income for the purposes of this Act.
- 25 (4) "Senior citizen" means a person who is 62 years of age or over on or before January
- 1 of the year in which application for the exemption under this Act is made.

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1 (b) Each resident of the Banks County school district who is a senior citizen is granted an

- 2 exemption on that person's homestead from all Banks County school district ad valorem
- 3 taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$20,000.00 of the assessed value of that
- 4 homestead. The exemption under this subsection shall only be granted if that person's
- 5 income, together with the income of the spouse who also occupies and resides at such
- 6 homestead does not exceed \$10,000.00 for the immediately preceding year. The value of
- 7 that property in excess of such exempted amount shall remain subject to taxation.
- 8 (c) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this
- 9 section unless the person or person's agent files an application with the tax commissioner of
- 10 Banks County giving the person's age and such additional information relative to receiving
- such exemption as will enable the tax commissioner to make a determination regarding the
- 12 initial and continuing eligibility of such owner for such exemption. The tax commissioner
- shall provide application forms for this purpose.
- 14 (d) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of
- 15 the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year
- as long as the owner occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the
- 17 proper application as provided in subsection (c) of this section, it shall not be necessary to
- 18 make application thereafter for any year, and the exemption shall continue to be allowed to
- 19 such person. It shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under this
- 20 Act to notify the tax commissioner of Banks County in the event that person for any reason
- 21 becomes ineligible for that exemption.
- 22 (e) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to or affect any
- 23 state ad valorem taxes, county ad valorem taxes for county purposes, municipal ad valorem
- 24 taxes for municipal purposes, or independent school district ad valorem taxes for educational
- 25 purposes. The homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall be in lieu
- of and not in addition to any other homestead exemption applicable to Banks County school
- 27 district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes.
- 28 (f) The exemption granted by this Act shall apply to all taxable years beginning on or after
- 29 January 1, 2007.

30 SECTION 2.

- 31 Unless prohibited by the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, the election
- 32 superintendent of Banks County shall call and conduct an election as provided in this section
- 33 for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Banks County school district for
- 34 approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that election on the date of
- 35 the November, 2006, state-wide general election and shall issue the call and conduct that
- 36 election as provided by general law. The election superintendent shall cause the date and

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1 purpose of the election to be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding

- 2 the date thereof in the official organ of Banks County. The ballot shall have written or
- 3 printed thereon the words:
- 4 "() YES Shall the Act be approved which provides a homestead exemption from
- 5 Banks County school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in
- 6 () NO the amount of \$20,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for
- 7 residents of that school district who are 62 years of age or over and whose
- 8 income, not including certain retirement income, does not exceed
- 9 \$10,000.00?"
- 10 All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and all persons desiring
- 11 to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes cast on
- such question are for approval of the Act, Section 1 of this Act shall become of full force and
- 13 effect on January 1, 2007. If the Act is not so approved or if the election is not conducted
- 14 as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act shall not become effective and this Act shall
- 15 be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following that election
- date. The expense of such election shall be borne by Banks County. It shall be the election
- superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State.
- 18 SECTION 3.
- 19 Except as otherwise provided in Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon
- 20 its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
- SECTION 4.
- 22 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
