## AS PASSED SENATE

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend an Act creating the State Court of Clayton County, approved January 28, 1964
- 2 (Ga. L. 1964, p. 2032), as amended, so as to provide that the solicitor-general of said court
- 3 may employ such assistant solicitors-general, deputy solicitors-general, or other attorneys,
- 4 investigators, paraprofessionals, clerical assistants, and other employees or independent
- 5 contractors as may be authorized by the Board of Commissioners of Clayton County; to
- 6 provide for compensation; to provide for qualifications; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 7 other purposes.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 An Act creating the State Court of Clayton County, approved January 28, 1964 (Ga. L. 1964,
- p. 2032), as amended, is amended by inserting following Section 7 a new section to be
- 12 designated Section 7A to read as follows:
- 13 "SECTION 7A.
- 14 (a) The solicitor-general may employ such assistant solicitors-general, deputy
- solicitors-general, or other attorneys, investigators, paraprofessionals, clerical assistants, and
- 16 other employees or independent contractors as may be authorized by the board of
- 17 commissioners. Such personnel shall be compensated by the county in a manner and amount
- 18 fixed by the solicitor-general with the approval of the board of commissioners.
- 19 (b) Any investigator appointed pursuant to this subsection shall meet the qualifications for
- 20 certification as a peace officer as provided in Chapter 8 of Title 35 of the O.C.G.A., the
- 21 'Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Act.' Such investigators shall exercise all
- 22 powers of a peace officer including the power to make arrest and to apply for, execute, and
- 23 return any warrant, rule, order, or process within Clayton County."
