

Senate Resolution 1272

A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Prescriptive Authority of Psychologists; and for
2 other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, it has been held by some that prescribing privileges for psychologists should
4 be pursued in order to improve the availability of comprehensive, quality mental health care;
5 and

6 WHEREAS, prescription medication is an important component of affordable and accessible
7 mental health services; and

8 WHEREAS, under existing state law, patients needing psychotropic medications must obtain
9 prescriptions from psychiatrists, who are in shorter supply and often charge higher rates; and

10 WHEREAS, many patients who need both psychotherapy and medication must see separate
11 practitioners, adding inconvenience and cost to their care, which can pose a substantial
12 burden in underserved rural areas; and

13 WHEREAS, a comprehensive evaluation of the limitations on the availability of prescription
14 medications is necessary to determine if current statutory restrictions require modification.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that there is created the Senate
16 Study Committee on Prescriptive Authority of Psychologists to be composed of five
17 members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Assignments, which
18 shall designate one member as the chairperson of the committee. The committee shall meet
19 at the call of the chairperson.

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the conditions,
21 needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any actions
22 or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate. The committee may

1 conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
2 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
3 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. The members of the committee
4 shall receive the allowances authorized for legislative members of interim legislative
5 committees but shall receive the same for not more than five days unless additional days are
6 authorized. The funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come
7 from the funds appropriated to the Senate. In the event the committee makes a report of its
8 findings and recommendations, with suggestions for proposed legislation, if any, such report
9 shall be made on or before December 31, 2006. The committee shall stand abolished on
10 December 31, 2006.
