- 1 Commending Charles Tyler Crump on becoming an Eagle Scout; and for other purposes.

3 the rank of Eagle Scout after passing his Eagle Board of Review on February 18, 2006; and
- 4 WHEREAS, to reach Eagle rank, a Scout must earn 21 merit badges, 12 of which are  
5 mandatory requirements for the Eagle Scout program; and

7 remove aged stands in the ball field area behind John Wesley United Methodist Church and  
8 to install new ones, coordinating fellow scouts and additional volunteers for over 235 service

11 Charles Tyler Crump has ably demonstrated his aptitude and competency in mastering the  
12 many special skills taught through the Boy Scout program; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Charles Tyler Crump has truly exhibited a commitment to the scouting  
14 principles of honesty and fairness and has consistently conducted himself in a manner  
15 becoming of an Eagle Scout; and
- 16 WHEREAS, in a world which all too often seems to dwell on the negative aspects of the  
17 actions of young people, it is especially fitting and proper for this body to recognize the  
18 outstanding accomplishments of this extraordinary young man.
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
20 the members of this body commend Charles Tyler Crump for his diligence and dedication  
21 in pursuing the highest honor awarded by the Boy Scouts of America and congratulate him  
22 on attaining the prestigious rank of Eagle Scout.
