- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Sweetin enjoyed a highly successful business career, during which he was
10 a partner in Williams Tile and Terrazzo Company and served as president of the National
11 Terrazzo and Mosaic Association and the Southeastern Tile Association, among other trade
12 organizations; and
- 13 WHEREAS, he was a founding member and the fifth president of the Cherokee Town and
14 Country Club, as well as an avid hunter; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Mr. Sweetin leaves behind a loving and devoted family, including his wife,
16 Mitzi Sweetin; his son and daughter-in-law, Greg and Kelly Sweetin; three grandchildren,
17 Tucker, Caroline, and Ansley; and his brother, Bud Sweetin; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Mr. Sweetin's passing has left an unfillable void in the hearts of all who knew
19 and loved this exceptional gentleman, and he will always be remembered with the greatest
20 affection for his integrity, generosity, and warm and loving spirit.
