

## House Resolution 1048 (RULES COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE)

## A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the House Study Committee on Market-Demand Skills Education in High Schools;  
2 and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, based on statistics of the Georgia Department of Labor, minority youth  
4 unemployment (ages 16-19) in this state is 41.9 percent and Caucasian youth unemployment  
5 in this state is 21.7 percent; and

6 WHEREAS, the international youth unemployment rate in the world's industrialized  
7 countries is 13.7 percent; and

8 WHEREAS, according to the U.S. Department of Labor, the City of Atlanta is among the ten  
9 cities in the country with the highest youth unemployment; and

10 WHEREAS, there has been found to be a direct correlation between high youth  
11 unemployment and high youth crime; and

12 WHEREAS, an increase in the number of skilled workers in this state can also impact and  
13 improve this state's economic development; and

14 WHEREAS, to encourage youth to complete high school and to obtain meaningful skills that  
15 can enable them to obtain worthwhile jobs, a growing number of states have passed  
16 legislation to implement programs to teach market-demand skills in high schools for students  
17 opting not to go to college; and

18 WHEREAS, market-demand skills vary from community to community, but can include  
19 areas such as automotive technology (motor and body repair), computer technology,  
20 construction trades (carpentry, electric, heating and air conditioning, masonry, plumbing,  
21 roofing), health care technology (CT scan, MRI), and hospitality (culinary arts, hotel  
22 management); and

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1 WHEREAS, a study of the issues surrounding the feasibility and usefulness of implementing  
2 a market-demand skills program in grades 10 through 12 in the public high schools in this  
3 state to address youth unemployment and to improve this state's economic development  
4 would be beneficial to determine whether legislative action should be recommended.

5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
6 there is created the House Study Committee on Market-Demand Skills Education in High  
7 Schools to be composed of five members. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall  
8 appoint five members of the House of Representatives as members of the committee and  
9 shall designate one of such members as chairperson. The committee shall meet at the call  
10 of the chairperson.

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the conditions,  
12 needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any actions  
13 or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate. The committee may  
14 conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or  
15 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and  
16 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. The legislative members of the  
17 committee shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official  
18 Code of Georgia Annotated. All other funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this  
19 resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives. The  
20 expenses and allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member  
21 of the committee for more than three days unless additional days are authorized. In the event  
22 the committee makes a report of its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for  
23 proposed legislation, if any, such report shall be made on or before December 31, 2006. The  
24 committee shall stand abolished on December 31, 2006.
