## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending the Reed-Broadnax-Ingram Family Reunion; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the Reed-Broadnax-Ingram Family Reunion will hold its 17th biennial meeting  
3 from July 14 through July 16, 2006, in Atlanta, Georgia, at the Embassy Suites Hotel; and
- 4 WHEREAS, John "Jack" Broadnax, the son of slave parents, was born in Putnam County,  
5 Georgia, in 1833; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Jack married Amanda in 1859 and, from their union, 14 children were born:  
7 Henry, John, Susan, Nancy, Sampson, Mary Ana, Anne, Lena, Asbury, Leila, Eliza, Lofton,  
8 Lonnie, and Reid; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Eliza married John Ingram; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Amanda Reed had one son, Edward Reed, prior to her marriage to Jack; and
- 11 WHEREAS, this will be the first family reunion held in the State of Georgia and the theme  
12 will be "Embracing Our Legacy"; and
- 13 WHEREAS, George B. Hopkins is serving as chairman of the executive board.
- 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
