## A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the memory of Wiley T. Nixon and naming the Wiley T. Nixon Capitol Post Office  
2 in his honor; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia recently lost one of her most distinguished citizens and  
4 public servants with the passing of Wiley T. Nixon; and

5 WHEREAS, Mr. Nixon began a career of public service at the State Capitol in 1969 as a  
6 doorkeeper for the House of Representatives and rose to the position of Postmaster,  
7 supervising two post offices at the Capitol that deliver thousands of pieces of mail each day;  
8 and

9 WHEREAS, his devotion to duty was exemplary, his job performance was outstanding, and  
10 he was well known and respected for his wisdom and wit; and

11 WHEREAS, above all else, those who were privileged to know Mr. Nixon will remember  
12 him best for his kindness and generosity, as he was a man who loved people and never  
13 ceased striving to help others; and

14 WHEREAS, the General Assembly will be the poorer in his absence but was truly blessed  
15 by his presence during his 36 years of public service; and

16 WHEREAS, it is fitting that Mr. Nixon's contributions to the State of Georgia be recognized  
17 with an enduring memorial.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT the  
19 Capitol Post Office adjacent to the House Chamber on the third floor of the State Capitol is  
20 hereby named the Wiley T. Nixon Capitol Post Office and the Legislative Fiscal Officer is  
21 authorized and directed to provide for the placement of an appropriate plaque and signage  
22 so designating said facility.
