A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 6 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2 relating to clerks of superior courts, so as to change sunset dates for real estate or personal
3 property filing fees; to change a sunset date relating to collection and remittance of real estate
4 or personal property filing fees; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and
5 for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 Article 2 of Chapter 6 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
9 clerks of superior courts, is amended by revising the introductory language of subsections
10 (f) and (f.1) of Code Section 15-6-77, relating to fees and construction of fee provisions, as
11 follows:

12 "(f) Until July 1, ~~2012~~ 2014, sums for filing documents, instruments, etc., pertaining to real
13 estate or personal property, such sums to include recording and returning where applicable,
14 shall be as follows:"

15 "(f.1) On and after July 1, ~~2012~~ 2014, sums for filing documents, instruments, etc.,
16 pertaining to real estate or personal property, such sums to include recording and
17 returning where applicable, shall be as follows:"

18 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 2.**

19 Said article is further amended by revising subsection (c) of Code Section 15-6-97, relating
20 to development and implementation of the state-wide uniform automated information system,
21 as follows:

22 "(c) This Code section shall be repealed in its entirety on July 1, ~~2012~~ 2014."

1 **SECTION 3.**

2 Said article is further amended by revising subsection (d) of Code Section 15-6-98 as
3 follows:

4 "(d) This Code section shall be repealed in its entirety on July 1, ~~2012~~ 2014."

5 **SECTION 4.**

6 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
