## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and
- 2 traffic, so as to add a points penalty for the use of cellular, hands-free, or mobile telephones
- 3 or other wireless communication devices under certain circumstances; to change certain
- 4 provisions related to exercising due care in operating a motor vehicle and the proper use of
- 5 radios and mobile telephones; to provide for definitions; to provide for a penalty; to provide
- 6 for exceptions; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 7 purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
