

## Senate Resolution 76

## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing and commending Steve Lundquist; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Steve Lundquist is the personification of excellence in competitive swimming  
3 and winner of two Olympic gold medals at the 1984 Summer Olympic Games; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Steve Lundquist is one of Clayton County's most beloved and famous citizens  
5 and a 1979 graduate of Jonesboro High School; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Mr. Lundquist was a member of the 1980 Olympic Team that did not participate  
7 in Moscow as part of the United States boycott but returned to the Olympic team in 1984,  
8 winning gold medals in the 100-meter breaststroke and the 400-meter medley relay; and
- 9 WHEREAS, he broke his first world record when he was only 17 and was the first swimmer  
10 to break two minutes in the 200-yard breaststroke, going on to win every 100-yard  
11 breaststroke event he entered from 1980 to 1983; and
- 12 WHEREAS, in 1996, Steve Lundquist played a major role when the Summer Olympic  
13 Games were hosted by Atlanta, and he was accorded the honor of being an Olympic flag  
14 bearer; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Mr. Lundquist continues to serve his community by volunteering to work for  
16 many charitable organizations; and
- 17 WHEREAS, in May, 2006, the Clayton County Board of Commissioners and the Clayton  
18 County School Board chose to recognize Steve Lundquist by dedicating the Steve Lundquist  
19 Aquatic Center in his honor; and
- 20 WHEREAS, this 150-meter Olympic-sized pool which seats 250 spectators provides a unique  
21 opportunity for the county to turn out future champions and support the county's youth; and

1 WHEREAS, the Steve Lundquist Aquatic Center represents the characteristics exemplified  
2 by this true American sports hero: "respect, sportsmanship, pride, tolerance, and honesty";  
3 and

4 WHEREAS, he is a shining example of the important impact that the efforts and spirit of  
5 individual athletes make on the quality of life received by the young people of this state, and  
6 it is abundantly fitting and proper that his amazing accomplishments and contributions be  
7 appropriately recognized.

8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
9 heartily and gratefully commend Olympic gold medalist Steve Lundquist for his  
10 accomplishments and contributions on behalf of swimming in Georgia and for the positive  
11 influence he has had upon the lives and futures of countless young people in this state and  
12 extend to him their most sincere best wishes for continued success, health, and happiness in  
13 the future.
