A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Part 7 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia  
2 Annotated, relating to HOPE scholarships and grants, so as to provide that qualified students  
3 who complete a home study course and who score in the ninetieth percentile or higher on a  
4 standardized college admission test shall be eligible for the HOPE scholarship; to provide  
5 for related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other  
6 purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 Part 7 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
10 relating to HOPE scholarships and grants, is amended by revising subsection (a) of Code  
11 Section 20-3-519.2, relating to eligibility requirements for a HOPE scholarship at a public  
12 postsecondary institution, as follows:

13 "(a) To be eligible for a HOPE scholarship, an entering freshman student seeking an  
14 associate or baccalaureate degree at an eligible public postsecondary institution shall:

15 (1) Meet residency requirements by meeting the requirements to be classified as a legal  
16 resident of Georgia as established by the program regulations promulgated by the Georgia  
17 Student Finance Commission which shall be based upon the in-state tuition policy of the  
18 board of regents and the in-state tuition guidelines set by the Department of Technical  
19 and Adult Education;

20 (2) Meet achievement standards by:

21 (A) Having graduated from an eligible high school while meeting the curriculum  
22 requirements of his or her program of study in 1993 or thereafter and meeting the  
23 requirements set out in the applicable subsection and paragraph of Code Section  
24 20-2-157; or

25 (B) In the case of a student who is otherwise qualified but:

1 (i) Did not graduate from high school or complete a home study program meeting the  
 2 requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690, having received the general  
 3 educational development (GED) diploma awarded by the Georgia Department of  
 4 Technical and Adult Education after June 30, 1993, provided that such student shall  
 5 only be eligible for a HOPE scholarship pursuant to subsection (e) of this Code  
 6 section;

7 (ii) Completed a home study program meeting the requirements of subsection (c) of  
 8 Code Section 20-2-690 in lieu of graduating from an eligible high school, earning a  
 9 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at an eligible public postsecondary  
 10 institution at the end of the quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 45  
 11 quarter hours or 30 semester hours, provided that such student shall be eligible to  
 12 receive a retroactive HOPE scholarship for such student's freshman year to be paid  
 13 at the end of the freshman year; or

14 (iii) Graduated from a high school which is not an eligible high school, earning a  
 15 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at an eligible public postsecondary  
 16 institution at the end of the quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 45  
 17 quarter hours or 30 semester hours, provided that such student shall be eligible to  
 18 receive a retroactive HOPE scholarship for such student's freshman year to be paid  
 19 at the end of the freshman year; and or

20 (C) In the case of an otherwise qualified student who completed a home study program  
 21 meeting the requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690 in lieu of  
 22 graduating from an eligible high school, earning a score in the ninetieth percentile or  
 23 higher on a standardized college admission test, such as the SAT or ACT; and

24 (3) Meet enrollment standards by being admitted, enrolled, and classified as an  
 25 undergraduate student in a matriculated status."

## 26 SECTION 2.

27 Said part is further amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 20-3-519.3, relating  
 28 to eligibility requirements for a HOPE scholarship at a private postsecondary institution, as  
 29 follows:

30 "(a) To be eligible for a HOPE scholarship, an entering freshman student seeking an  
 31 associate or baccalaureate degree at an eligible private postsecondary institution shall:

32 (1) Meet residency requirements by meeting the requirements to be classified as a legal  
 33 resident of Georgia as established by the program regulations promulgated by the Georgia  
 34 Student Finance Commission;

35 (2) Meet achievement standards by:

1 (A) Having graduated from an eligible high school while meeting the curriculum  
 2 requirements of his or her program of study in 1996 or thereafter and meeting the  
 3 requirements set out in the applicable paragraph of subsection (b) of Code Section  
 4 20-2-157; ~~or~~

5 (B) In the case of a student who is otherwise qualified but:

6 (i) Did not graduate from high school or complete a home study program meeting the  
 7 requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690, having received the general  
 8 educational development (GED) diploma awarded by the Georgia Department of  
 9 Technical and Adult Education after June 30, 1993, provided that such student shall  
 10 only be eligible for a HOPE scholarship pursuant to subsection (e) of this Code  
 11 section;

12 (ii) Completed a home study program meeting the requirements of subsection (c) of  
 13 Code Section 20-2-690 in lieu of graduating from an eligible high school, earning a  
 14 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at an eligible public postsecondary  
 15 institution at the end of the quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 45  
 16 quarter hours or 30 semester hours, provided that such student shall be eligible to  
 17 receive a retroactive HOPE scholarship for such student's freshman year to be paid  
 18 at the end of the freshman year; or

19 (iii) Graduated from a high school which is not an eligible high school, earning a  
 20 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 at an eligible public postsecondary  
 21 institution at the end of the quarter or semester in which the student has attempted 45  
 22 quarter hours or 30 semester hours, provided that such student shall be eligible to  
 23 receive a retroactive HOPE scholarship for such student's freshman year to be paid  
 24 at the end of the freshman year; ~~and~~ or

25 (C) In the case of an otherwise qualified student who completed a home study program  
 26 meeting the requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690 in lieu of  
 27 graduating from an eligible high school, earning a score in the ninetieth percentile or  
 28 higher on a standardized college admission test, such as the SAT or ACT; and

29 (3) Meet enrollment standards by:

30 (A) Being admitted, enrolled, and classified as an undergraduate student in a  
 31 matriculated status; and

32 (B) Being registered for and attending classes as at least a half-time student for 14 days  
 33 or more after the last day of the institution's drop and add period."

### 34 SECTION 3.

35 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law  
 36 without such approval.

1 **SECTION 4.**

2 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
