## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 1, 2007, as "Community Health Centers Day"; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, federally qualified community health centers located in over 100 medically
- 3 underserved communities provide high quality primary and preventive health care to 239,000
- 4 people in the State of Georgia, including the working poor, uninsured, underinsured, elderly,
- 5 homeless, immigrants, and other vulnerable populations, without regard to income status,
- 6 cultural or ethnic heritage, or disease conditions; and
- 7 WHEREAS, community health centers bring over \$34 million per year to Georgia
- 8 communities, recruit and retain excellent health care professionals where they are most
- 9 needed, and offer access to a wide range of cost-effective medical and dental services and
- 10 prescription medicines as well as to health education, nutrition counseling, translation
- services, community outreach transportation, and support programs; and
- 12 WHEREAS, community health centers have a track record spanning four decades of
- 13 controlling costs, documented in several studies which show that rates of costly emergency
- 14 room visits, hospitalizations, and specialty care referrals are much lower among health center
- 15 patients than patients of other providers; and
- 16 WHEREAS, community health centers save the Medicaid program 30 to 33 percent in annual
- 17 spending per Medicaid beneficiary; and
- 18 WHEREAS, community health centers work in partnership with other health care providers,
- 19 local hospitals, health departments, social service agencies, and health related support
- 20 services to maximize resources and assure that services are coordinated to improve the health
- 21 status of the community; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Georgia's community health centers and the Georgia Association for Primary
- Health Care have supported President George W. Bush's goal of increasing the number of

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1 community health centers in Georgia and across the nation and have taken a leadership role

- 2 in establishing more centers in underserved communities to help resolve this state's health
- 3 care access problems, demonstrating commendable efforts in continuous quality
- 4 improvement, reduction of health disparities among the underserved, the implementation of
- 5 new health care initiatives such as Medicaid managed care and electronic health records, and
- 6 utilization of the latest technology to improve both operations and delivery of services to
- 7 more Georgians; and
- 8 WHEREAS, community health centers deserve commendation for their valuable
- 9 contributions in expanding access to health care, their outstanding record of service, and their
- 10 dedication to improving health care and the health status of all Georgians.
- 11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 12 recognize the foregoing by designating February 1, 2007, as "Community Health Centers
- 13 Day."
- 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 15 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Georgia Association for Primary
- 16 Health Care.
