A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the United States Congress to amend the citizenship laws of the United States to
- 2 provide that persons born in this country to alien parents become citizens at birth only if the
- 3 mother is in this country legally; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, the United States is facing a crisis of illegal immigration into this country; and
- 5 WHEREAS, it is estimated that there are between 12 million to 30 million persons living in
- 6 the United States illegally; and
- 7 WHEREAS, under the laws of this nation, a person born in this country becomes a citizen
- 8 of this country based solely upon the fact of the person's birth within the United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, it is not in the best interests of this nation to allow children born to parents who
- are not citizens of this country and who are in this country illegally to become citizens by
- virtue of their birth in this country; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Congress should act quickly to amend the citizenship laws of the United States
- 13 to provide that a person born in this country to alien parents becomes a citizen at birth only
- 14 if the mother is in this country legally before the problem becomes more dire than it already
- 15 is.
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 17 the members of this body urge the United States Congress to amend the citizenship laws of
- 18 the United States to provide that a person born in this country to alien parents becomes a
- 19 citizen at birth only if the mother is in this country legally.
- 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 21 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Vice President Richard
