

Senate Bill 100

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 16-9-4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
2 crime of knowingly manufacturing, selling, or distributing false identification documents,
3 so as to increase certain penalties; to provide for exceptions for persons over 21 years of age;
4 to provide for related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
5 other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Code Section 16-9-4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the crime of
9 knowingly manufacturing, selling, or distributing false identification documents, is amended
10 by revising subsection (c) as follows:

11 "(c)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) or (3) of this subsection, any person who
12 violates paragraph ~~(1), (2),~~ (3); or (6) of subsection (b) of this Code section shall be guilty
13 of a misdemeanor.

14 (2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, any Any person who violates
15 paragraph ~~(2),~~ (3); or (6) of subsection (b) of this Code section for the second or any
16 subsequent offense shall be guilty of a felony and shall be punished by a fine of not more
17 than \$25,000.00 or by imprisonment for not more than three years, or both.

18 (3) Any person who manufactures, alters, sells, distributes, delivers, receives, possesses,
19 or offers for sale or distribution three or more identification documents in violation of
20 subsection (b) of this Code section shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than
21 three nor more than ten years, a fine not to exceed the amount specified by Code Section
22 17-10-8, or both.

23 (4) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, any Any person 21 years of
24 age or older who violates paragraph (1), (2), (4), or (5) of subsection (b) of this Code
25 section shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than five years,
26 a fine not to exceed the amount specified by Code Section 17-10-8, or both.

1 (5) Any person under 21 years of age who violates paragraph (b) of this Code section
2 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

3 ~~(5)~~(6) Any person convicted of an attempt or conspiracy to violate subsection (b) of this
4 Code section shall be punished by imprisonment, by a fine, or by both such punishments
5 not to exceed the maximum punishment prescribed for the offense the commission of
6 which was the object of the attempt or conspiracy."

7 **SECTION 2.**

8 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2007, and shall apply to all offenses committed
9 on or after that date.

10 **SECTION 3.**

11 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
