

House Bill 466

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to game and fish, so
2 as to change certain provisions relating to license, permit, tag, and stamp fees; to provide for
3 permits for quality deer management programs on privately owned tracts of land; to provide
4 requirements for such programs; to change certain provisions relating to unlawful enticement
5 of game; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to game and fish, is amended in
9 paragraph (1) of Code Section 27-2-23, relating to license, permit, tag, and stamp fees, by
10 adding a new subparagraph to read as follows:

11 "(F.2) Quality deer management license Annual. \$20.00"

12 **SECTION 2.**

13 Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

14 "27-3-51.

15 (a) Subject to the provisions of this Code section, the department may issue an annual
16 permit to an owner or lessee of a privately owned tract of land for the purpose of operating
17 a quality deer management program for such tract.

18 (b) Any landowner or lessee of a privately owned tract of land who desires to obtain such
19 a permit may apply to the department on forms provided by the department. Any such
20 application shall be accompanied by the owner's or lessee's proposed quality deer
21 management plan that is signed by a wildlife biologist and includes:

- 22 (1) A map of the tract, in such scale and with such detail as required by the department;
- 23 (2) A detailed set of management requirements aimed at protecting from harvest all 1.5
24 year-old and younger bucks unless they are obviously injured or sick;

1 (3) A plan for removing those adult bucks which, because of poor antler quality, could
2 be categorized as inferior or culls;

3 (4) Specified minimum and maximum numbers of does, on a per hundred acre basis, to
4 be removed from the tract to keep the total deer population at or below carrying capacity
5 of the land; and

6 (5) Provisions for maintaining a high quality protein diet for the deer population
7 throughout the year and not just during hunting seasons. The plan may include food plots
8 or supplemental feedings, or both, which may consist of peanuts, soybeans, pelletized
9 commercial feed, or any other mix of foods that contains at least 18 percent protein by
10 weight. If food plots or supplemental feedings are included, then the plan must specify
11 routine relocating and dispersing of supplemental feeding locations or stations so as to
12 minimize threats of spreading disease.

13 (c)(1) In addition to the permit required by this Code section, each applicant shall be
14 required to obtain a private shooting preserve license or commercial shooting preserve
15 license, as applicable, and pay the fee required by Code Section 27-2-23.

16 (2) The department may establish and require a fee for the permit under this Code section
17 in such amount, on a per acre basis, as may be reasonable and necessary to offset part or
18 all of the cost of administering the program.

19 (d) No permit shall be issued under this Code section unless the management plan is
20 approved by the department as conforming with sound principles of wildlife management.
21 If the department denies an application, it shall state the reasons for such denial. Any
22 applicant who is denied a permit may submit a new application.

23 (e) Each permit granted under this Code section shall be subject to the condition that the
24 department may modify the permit and management plan whenever, in the judgment of the
25 department, such modification is necessary and appropriate to conform with sound
26 principles of wildlife management. Each permit for a tract and all deer hunting on a
27 permitted tract shall be subject to compliance with the terms of the approved management
28 plan and any modification imposed by the department.

29 (f) In addition to any other hunting license required by this title, any person hunting deer
30 on a tract for which a permit has been issued under this Code section shall be required to
31 have a quality deer management stamp affixed to such hunting license. The fee for any
32 such stamp shall be as provided by Code Section 27-2-23.

33 (g) For purposes of a tract permitted under this Code section, the department may,
34 consistent with sound wildlife management principles, approve specific maximum
35 possession and bag limits that vary from those maximum possession and bag limits
36 otherwise established under Code Section 27-3-15.

1 (h) Providing supplemental feed for deer and hunting deer over or near such supplemental
 2 feed location or station shall be lawful to the extent that such feeding is in accordance with
 3 the approved management plan for such tract.

4 (i) If a permittee detects or becomes aware of any sign of sickness in a deer on the
 5 permitted tract, he or she shall notify the department the next business day for purposes of
 6 determining the disease agent.

7 (j) Each permit shall expire annually on July 31. Each permittee shall, not later than such
 8 expiration date, report to the department the numbers of bucks and does taken on such tract
 9 during the preceding hunting season and the estimated ages thereof.

10 (k) Except as otherwise provided by this Code section, all other applicable provisions of
 11 this title and rules and regulations issued by the department shall apply to deer hunting on
 12 such tract.

13 (l) The board shall adopt such rules and regulations as are reasonable and necessary for
 14 purposes of this Code section."

15 SECTION 3.

16 Said title is further amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 27-3-9, relating to
 17 the unlawful enticement of game, as follows:

18 "(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to place, expose, deposit, distribute, or scatter any
 19 corn, wheat, or other grains, salts, apples, or other feeds or bait so as to constitute a lure or
 20 attraction or enticement for any game bird or game animal on or over any area where
 21 hunters are or will be hunting; provided, however, that is:

22 (1) The prohibition of this subsection shall not apply and it shall be lawful to hunt deer
 23 within the vicinity of such feeds if the hunter is at least 200 yards away from and not
 24 within sight of the feed or bait; and

25 (2) The prohibition of this subsection shall not apply and it shall be lawful to hunt deer
 26 within the vicinity of such feeds used as a lure or attraction or enticement for deer on a
 27 privately owned tract of land subject to a permitted quality deer management program as
 28 provided by Code Section 27-3-51."

29 SECTION 4.

30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
