A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 4 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 criminal attempt, conspiracy, and solicitation, so as to increase the maximum punishment for 3 convictions for criminal attempt to commit felonies punishable by death or life 4 imprisonment; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date and 5 applicability; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

8 Chapter 4 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to criminal attempt,

9 conspiracy, and solicitation, is amended by revising Code Section 16-4-6, relating to
10 penalties for criminal attempt, as follows:

11 ″16-4-6.

12 (a) A person convicted of the offense of criminal attempt to commit a crime punishable

by death or by life imprisonment shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one
year nor more than ten <u>30</u> years.

(b) A person convicted of the offense of criminal attempt to commit a felony, <u>other than</u>
<u>a felony punishable by death or life imprisonment</u>, shall be punished by imprisonment for
not less than one year nor more than one-half the maximum period of time for which he <u>or</u>
<u>she</u> could have been sentenced if he <u>or she</u> had been convicted of the crime attempted, by

19 one-half the maximum fine to which he <u>or she</u> could have been subjected if he <u>or she</u> had

- 20 been convicted of the crime attempted, or both.
- (c) A person convicted of the offense of criminal attempt to commit a misdemeanor shall
 be punished as for a misdemeanor."

SECTION 2.

This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2007, and shall apply to all crimes committed onand after that date.
