- 4 WHEREAS, David S. Scott passed from this life on January 10, 2007. He left a loving wife,
5 Vernice Scott, children Vincente Scott, Richie Scott and Beverly Merritt, three step-children
6 Mitchell Wilson, Debbie Fenner and Jacqueline Marshall and a host of grandchildren,

- 15 WHEREAS, he and wife Vernice were honored at the Clayton County Branch of the
16 NAACP Freedom Fund Banquet in October, 2006 for their dedicated community service;

- 18 WHEREAS, his pleasant demeanor, great sense of humor and trademark smile will be
19 missed. His legacy of community service will continue to serve as an inspiration for others.
