

House Bill 569

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 12-8-24 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 permits for solid waste or special solid waste handling, disposal, or thermal treatment
3 technology facility and inspection of solid waste generators, so as to change certain
4 provisions relating to permit requirement; to provide for authorization by local Act of the
5 General Assembly as a precondition for the granting of a permit for construction of a new
6 landfill; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 Code Section 12-8-24 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to permits for solid
10 waste or special solid waste handling, disposal, or thermal treatment technology facility and
11 inspection of solid waste generators, is amended by revising subsection (a) as follows:

12 "(a)(1) No person shall engage in solid waste or special solid waste handling in Georgia
13 or construct or operate a solid waste handling facility in Georgia, except those individuals
14 exempted from this part under Code Section 12-8-30.10, without first obtaining a permit
15 from the director authorizing such activity.

16 (2) In addition to any other requirements of this article, the direction shall not issue any
17 permit pursuant to application made on or after the effective date of this Code section for
18 construction of a new landfill in any county or municipality unless at the time of such
19 application the construction and operation of new landfills in such jurisdiction is
20 authorized by local Act of the General Assembly. Any such local Act shall be limited
21 solely to a general authorization for such jurisdiction applicable to all new landfill permit
22 applicants, with no other conditions or requirements."

23 **SECTION 2.**

24 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
25 without such approval.

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SECTION 3.

2 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
