The House Committee on Higher Education offers the following substitute to HB 152:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Part 7 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia 2 Annotated, relating to HOPE scholarships and grants, so as to provide that otherwise 3 qualified students who score in the eighty-fifth percentile or higher nationally on a 4 standardized college admission test shall be eligible for the HOPE scholarship; to provide 5 for related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 6 purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

9 Part 7 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,

10 relating to HOPE scholarships and grants, is amended by revising subsection (a) of Code

Section 20-3-519.2, relating to eligibility requirements for a HOPE scholarship at a public
postsecondary institution, as follows:
