A RESOLUTION

1 Dedicating certain portions of the state highway system; and for other purposes.

2 PART I

- 3 WHEREAS, Paul Keenan has contributed immensely to the quality of life enjoyed by the
- 4 citizens of Dougherty County and the City of Albany, Georgia, as a result of his
- 5 distinguished public service; and
- 6 WHEREAS, this successful businessman, attorney, and Albany native served his community
- 7 for 14 years as chairman of the board of commissioners of Dougherty County and four years
- 8 as mayor of the City of Albany; and
- 9 WHEREAS, throughout both periods of public service he was instrumental in improving
- 10 community relations, strengthening communication and cooperation between the city and the
- 11 county governmental authorities, and promoting local economic development; and
- 12 WHEREAS, his business expertise and legal knowledge have enabled him to offer valuable
- 13 leadership and well-reasoned solutions to various complex governmental and financial
- 14 problems; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Paul Keenan's leadership was instrumental in the construction of many highway
- projects in the City of Albany and Dougherty County, including US 19, US 82, the Bypass,
- 17 Oakridge Drive, Dawson Road, Gillionville Road, and Westover Road; and
- 18 WHEREAS, his marriage to Lucile Dennison, a fellow law student at Emory University,
- 19 included rearing four accomplished children, and his public career and accomplishments
- 20 reflect the endorsement, admiration, and respect he has within his family and the community
- 21 at large.

1 PART II

- 2 WHEREAS, James H. Chandler, Jr., was only 33 years old when he was fatally injured in
- 3 a traffic accident while he was responding to a bank alarm on his police motorcycle; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the accident occurred on September 24, 1982, at the intersection of SR 1 and
- 5 Cloud Springs Road, and James died the next day from his injuries; and
- 6 WHEREAS, he was a graduate of Lakeview High School and the Floyd College Regional
- 7 Police Academy; and
- 8 WHEREAS, at the time of his death, James had worked with the Fort Oglethorpe Police
- 9 Department for four years, and in 1999, the police department's training facility was named
- 10 in his honor; and
- 11 WHEREAS, James was often described as a big guy, with a big heart, who loved his job; and
- 12 WHEREAS, he left behind his beautiful wife Jeannie and three sons, Mark, Brian, and Sean;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, it is only fitting that the memory of James H. Chandler be perpetuated by a
- 15 lasting monument to his life well-lived.

16 PART III

- 17 WHEREAS, The Battle of Chickamauga, named after the Chickamauga Creek which flowed
- 18 nearby, was fought September 19-20, 1863, and involved more than 150,000 soldiers of the
- 19 Northern and Southern Armies; and
- 20 WHEREAS, the landscape of the battle was one where neither army wanted to fight and the
- 21 thick forest limited visibility to 150 feet, less than the range of a rifle, cannon were useless
- 22 and often the fighting was hand-to-hand; and
- 23 WHEREAS, during the battle, soldiers were cared for in the nearby homes and adjacent
- 24 buildings, with many Union doctors remaining behind to care for the wounded after the
- 25 Southern victory, and many parched and wounded soldiers of both sides drank from the
- 26 town's bubbling Crawfish Spring, still active today; and

1 WHEREAS, the corridors of the two highways dedicated in this resolution follow the general

- 2 route of march for the two armies that fought in The Battle of Chickamauga; and
- 3 WHEREAS, it is only fitting to honor the brave men who fought and died here with a lasting
- 4 memorial to their sacrifice.

5 PART IV

- 6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 7 GEORGIA that the portion of SR 3 from the Mitchell/Dougherty county line (Mile Post 0)
- 8 north to the Dougherty/Lee county line (Mile Post 15.08), in Dougherty County, be dedicated
- 9 as the Paul Keenan Parkway.
- 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this body dedicate the intersection of
- 11 SR 1 and Cloud Springs Road as the James H. Chandler, Jr. Memorial Intersection.
- 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this body dedicate the portion of SR 341
- 13 from its intersection with SR 193 north to its intersection with Gordon Street in Chickamauga
- 14 as the Federal Army of the Cumberland Highway.
- 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this body dedicate the portion of SR 1
- 16 from its intersection with SR 48 in Summerville north through LaFayette on US Highway
- 17 27/SR 1 north through Shields Cross Road, US Highway 27/SR 1, to the intersection of Old
- 18 LaFayette Road and Frank Gleason Highway as the CSA Army of Tennessee Highway.
- 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and
- 20 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the road facilities named in this
- 21 resolution.
- 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 23 to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to Paul Keenan, the family of James H.
- 24 Chandler, Jr., the City of Chickamauga, and the Department of Transportation.
