## AS PASSED SENATE

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 3 of Chapter 13 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the Division of Archives and History, so as to authorize the Secretary of State to
- 3 designate and establish facilities occupied by a government agency as a branch depository
- 4 under certain circumstances; to provide that the Division of Archives and History shall own
- 5 and operate any equipment necessary to manage and retain control of electronic archival
- 6 records but may contract with third parties for services related to the management of such
- 7 records; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.** 

- 10 Article 3 of Chapter 13 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 11 Division of Archives and History, is amended by revising Code Section 45-13-45, relating
- 12 to powers of Secretary of State with respect to management of division generally, by adding
- 13 a new subsection as follows:
- 14 "(c) The Secretary of State is authorized to designate and establish, as a branch depository
- of the Division of Archives and History for the storage and retention of permanent records,
- temporary records, or security backup media in any format, facilities occupied by any
- government agency; provided, however, that no such designation and establishment of a

branch depository shall be made unless the Secretary of State shall obtain the prior written

- approval of the government agency involved. Records in the custody of such depositories
- shall be subject to the same laws, standards, and policies as any records in the physical
- custody of the Division of Archives and History including, but not limited to, Code Section
- 22 50-18-98. The Secretary of State may expend such funds as are necessary or desirable for
- 23 the maintenance and operation of any such facilities; for the preservation and safeguarding
- of the contents thereof; and for the employment of such persons as are necessary and
- desirable for the accomplishment of such maintenance, operation, preservation, and
- safeguarding. Such depositories may be operated on a cost recovery basis. The Secretary
- of State may enter into such contractual arrangements as he or she deems to be in the public

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1 interest for creating and operating such branch depositories. The records or digital content

- 2 maintained in such branch depositories shall be under the immediate management and
- 3 control of the Division of Archives and History. The Secretary of State may abolish such
- 4 branch depository at any time."

5 SECTION 2.

- 6 Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 45-13-46, relating to surrender of
- 7 materials to division for preservation, as follows:
- 8 "45-13-46.
- 9 (a) Any state, county, or other official is authorized, in his or her discretion, to turn over
- 10 for permanent preservation in the Division of Archives and History any official books,
- 11 records, documents, original papers, manuscript files, newspaper files, portraits, and
- printed volumes not in current use in his or her office. Any record created or received by
- a state agency, constitutional officer, or Speaker of the House of Representatives in the
- performance of a public duty or paid for by public funds and certified by the director of the
- 15 Division of Archives and History as necessary to document the history, organization,
- functions, policies, decisions, and procedures of the agency or office shall be placed for
- 17 permanent preservation in the Division of Archives and History when no longer in current
- use by the agency or officer. The Secretary of State shall provide for the preservation of
- said materials; and, when so surrendered, copies thereof shall be made and certified by the
- director upon the application of any person interested, which certification shall have the
- same force and effect as if made by the officers originally in custody of them and for which
- the same fees shall be charged.
- 23 (b) The Division of Archives and History shall own and operate any equipment necessary
- 24 to manage and retain control of electronic archival records in its custody but may, at its
- 25 <u>discretion, contract with third-party entities to provide any or all services related to</u>
- 26 managing archival records on equipment owned by the contractor, by other third parties,
- 27 <u>or by the Division of Archives and History.</u>
- 28 (b) (c) Personal and official records and papers of the Lieutenant Governor and the
- 29 Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be exempt from the provisions of subsection
- 30 (a) of this Code section when such records and papers are deposited in a repository that
- 31 meets the minimum archival and public access standards promulgated by the Division of
- 32 Archives and History.
- 33 (c) (d) As used in this Code section, the term 'constitutional officer' means any officer
- enumerated in Article V, Section I, Paragraph I; Article V, Section I, Paragraph III; or
- 35 Article V, Section III, Paragraph I of the Constitution of the State of Georgia."

SECTION 3.

2 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
