## A RESOLUTION

1 Expressing regret at the passing of Alfred W. Jones, Jr.; and for other purposes.

- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia lost one of its finest and most distinguished citizens with
- 3 the tragic and untimely passing of Alfred W. Jones, Jr., on Saturday, March 24, 2007; and
- WHEREAS, Alfred W. Jones, Jr., was former president and chairman of the board of Sea
  Island Company and a long-time community leader; and

6 WHEREAS, born in 1930 in Savannah, Georgia, Mr. Jones was reared on Sea Island,

- 7 Georgia, the oldest child of Alfred W. and Katharine Talbott Jones; and
- 8 WHEREAS, after completing prep school at Millbrook School in New York, he received a
- 9 degree in Agricultural Economics from the University of Georgia in 1952 and also attended
- 10 the advanced management program at Harvard University in 1972; and
- 11 WHEREAS, after serving three years as an officer in the United States Navy, he was briefly
- 12 employed by Seaboard Construction Company prior to beginning his career with Sea Island
- 13 Company in 1956, when he became a director and assistant to the president, A.W. Jones, Sr.;
- 14 and
- WHEREAS, by 1966 he had become president of Sea Island Company and in 1980 became
  chairman, a position he retained until his retirement in 1997 while turning the role of
  president over to his son, Bill Jones III, in 1993; and
- WHEREAS, by the time of his death, Sea Island Company had grown to own and operate
  not only the Cloister, which was opened by his father and company founder Howard Coffin
  in 1928, but also The Lodge at Sea Island, The Lodge at Cabin Bluff, Ocean Forest Golf
  Club, and Frederica Golf Club, as well as a highly successful real estate division; and

1 WHEREAS, colleagues credit him with modernizing the company's business infrastructure,

2 expanding guest accommodations and amenities, and overseeing long-range planning for the

3 resort; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Jones was a supporter of many civic and philanthropic causes throughout
his life including the creation of the Wesley Memorial Garden and gifts of land for Wesley
United Methodist Church at Frederica, Christian Renewal Church, and Frederica

7 Presbyterian Church, among others; and

8 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife of 51 years, Betty Macdonald Jones; their three 9 children, Ann Jones Gregg of St. Simons Island; Bill Jones III of St. Simons Island; and Jim 10 Jones of St. Simons Island and New York; three grandchildren, two sisters, and ten nieces 11 and nephews; and

WHEREAS, the untimely passing of this generous, kind, and devoted family man leaves anunfillable void in the hearts and lives of his family and friends.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that

15 the members of this body express their deepest and most sincere regret at the passing of

16 Alfred W. Jones, Jr., and recognize the warm, wonderful spirit of this man expressed in his

17 lifetime by the numerous contributions he made to his community, all of southeast Georgia,

18 and the entire state.
