14 the Youth Witness Evangelism for Christ at St. Peter Missionary Baptist Church; and
- 15 WHEREAS, her love of life and vitality left an unforgettable impression on everyone she  
16 met; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the passing of this vibrant young woman leaves an unfillable void in the hearts  
18 and lives of her family and friends.
