- 1 Commending the Reverend Charles Lee White, Jr.; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the Reverend Charles Lee White, Jr., is an inspirational community leader and
- 3 servant of God and his fellow man; and
- 4 WHEREAS, he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Religious Studies from the University
- 5 of South Carolina, where he served as Lay Campus Minister, and entered Gammon
- 6 Theological Seminary of the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta, Georgia,
- 7 where he was conferred a Masters of Divinity with a concentration in Christian Education;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, the Reverend Charles Lee White, Jr., is an ordained Elder and Full Member of
- 10 the South Carolina Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church and served six years
- as Senior Pastor of the Clover Parish, which includes the congregations of the Clover Chapel,
- 12 Green Pond, and Mount Harmony United Methodist Churches, where he led the development
- 13 of several church and community initiatives; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the Reverend Charles Lee White, Jr., served with distinction as Director of the
- 15 Southeast Region of the NAACP headquartered in Atlanta, Georgia, since 1999, and he has
- 16 made numerous contributions to make the Southeastern United States a better place to live
- 17 for all people; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the Reverend Charles Lee White, Jr., has been recently appointed to serve as
- 19 the National Director of Field Operations of the NAACP; and
- 20 WHEREAS, the Reverend Charles Lee White, Jr., is also a proud member of Eta Lambda
- 21 Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity in Atlanta, and he sits on the Board of Trustees for
- 22 the African American Male Research, Success, and Leadership initiative at the University
- 23 of West Georgia; and

1 WHEREAS, the Reverend Charles Lee White, Jr., is the founder of Brothers United for

- 2 Change, a ministry that has gained national attention; and
- 3 WHEREAS, the Reverend's civil rights undertakings include becoming the first African
- 4 American member of the Clover Rotary Club and the first African American member of the
- 5 University of South Carolina Chaplains Association; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the Reverend won a precedent setting 1993 verdict against the Buffalo Room
- 7 in North Augusta, South Carolina, for refusing to serve him and five other NAACP officials
- 8 because of their race; and
- 9 WHEREAS, that was the first time in the state's history that an African American citizen
- 10 recovered monetary damages for race discrimination using the claim of outrage; and
- 11 WHEREAS, the suit led to a stronger Public Accommodations Law being adopted by the
- 12 South Carolina Legislature; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the Reverend Charles Lee White, Jr., is a resident of Ellenwood, Georgia, and
- 14 he is the faithful husband of Adrienne and the loving father of Dwayne, who serves in the
- 15 United States army, and Alexander, a recent graduate of the University of South Carolina and
- 16 a member of the United States air force reserve.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 18 the members of this body commend Reverend Charles Lee White, Jr., the National Director
- 19 of Field Operations of the NAACP for his innumerable good works in the name of social
- 20 justice, congratulate him upon the occasion of the dedication of the 55th Annual Civil Rights
- 21 Advocacy Training Institute, and extend to him their sincerest best wishes for the future.
