- 8 Part 1 of Article 2 of Chapter 12 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to gambling offenses, is amended by revising Code Section 16-12-37, relating to
- 10 dogfighting, as follows:
- 11 "16-12-37.
- 12 (a) A person commits the offense of dogfighting when he causes or allows a dog to fight
- another dog for sport or gaming purposes or maintains or operates any event at which dogs
- 14 are allowed or encouraged to fight one another.
- 15 (b) A person convicted of the offense of dogfighting shall be punished by a mandatory fine
- of \$5,000.00 or by a mandatory fine of \$5,000.00 and imprisonment for not less than one
- 17 year nor more than five years.
- 18 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'dog' means any domestic canine.
- 19 (b) Any person who:
- 20 (1) Owns, possesses, trains, transports, or sells any dog with the intent that such dog shall
- be engaged in fighting with another dog;
- 22 (2) For amusement or gain, causes any dog to fight with another dog or for amusement
- or gain, causes any dogs to injure each other;
- 24 (3) Wagers money or anything of value on the result of such dogfighting; or

1 (4) Knowingly permits any act in violation of paragraph (1) or (2) of this subsection on

2 any premises under the ownership or control of such person or knowingly aids or abets

- 3 <u>any such act</u>
- 4 shall be guilty of a felony and, upon the first conviction thereof, shall be punished by
- 5 imprisonment of not less than one nor more than five years, a fine of not less than
- 6 \$5,000.00, or both such fine and imprisonment. On a second or subsequent conviction,
- 7 such person shall be punished by imprisonment of not less than one nor more than ten
- 8 years, a fine of not less than \$15,000.00, or both such fine and imprisonment. Each act or
- 9 <u>omission in violation of this subsection shall constitute a separate offense.</u>
- 10 (c) Any person who is knowingly present only as a spectator at any place for the fighting
- of dogs shall, upon a first conviction thereof, be guilty of a misdemeanor of a high and
- 12 <u>aggravated nature</u>. On a second conviction, such person shall be guilty of a felony and
- shall be punished by imprisonment of not less than one nor more than five years, a fine of
- not less than \$5,000.00, or both such fine and imprisonment. On a third or subsequent
- conviction, such person shall be punished by imprisonment of not less than one nor more
- than ten years, a fine of not less than \$15,000.00, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- Each act in violation of this subsection shall constitute a separate offense.

- 20 (e) This Code section shall not prohibit, impede, or otherwise interfere with animal
- 21 <u>husbandry, training techniques, competition, events, shows, or practices not otherwise</u>
- 22 specifically prohibited by law and shall not apply to the following activities:
- 23 (1) Owning, using, breeding, training, or equipping any animal to pursue, take, hunt, or
- 24 recover wildlife or any animal lawfully hunted under Title 27 or participating in hunting
- or fishing in accordance with the provisions of Title 27 and rules and regulations
- 26 promulgated pursuant thereto as such rules and regulations existed on the date specified
- 27 <u>in Code Section 27-1-39;</u>
- 28 (2) Owning, using, breeding, training, or equipping dogs to work livestock for
- 29 <u>agricultural purposes in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Commissioner</u>
- of Agriculture as such rules and regulations existed on January 1, 2008;
- 31 (3) Owning, using, breeding, training, or equipping dogs for law enforcement purposes
- or for use as guard dogs; or
- 33 (4) Owning, using, breeding, training, or equipping any animal to control damage from
- 34 <u>nuisance or pest species in and around structures or agricultural operations."</u>
