A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the United States Department of Transportation to reconsider its mission and purpose;
- 2 and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation was established by an act of
- 4 Congress on October 15, 1966, and the department's first official day of operation was
- 5 April 1, 1967; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the mission of the department is to "Serve the United States by ensuring a fast,
- 7 safe, efficient, accessible and convenient transportation system that meets our vital national
- 8 interests and enhances the quality of life of the American people, today and into the future."
- 9 WHEREAS, the main mission of the department has largely been fulfilled by the completion
- 10 of the federal interstate highway system; and
- WHEREAS, state and local governments are faced with difficult decisions regarding local
- 12 transportation needs on a continuing and ever-increasing basis; and
- WHEREAS, the state motor fuel taxes charged to the citizens of Georgia are needlessly sent
- 14 to the federal government before being returned to the state government; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Georgia is a donor state and does not receive back as much motor fuel tax as
- 16 it collects and sends to the federal government.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 GEORGIA that this body urges making the funds collected under the federal gas tax
- 19 immediately available to individual states to fund their transportation needs.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body urges the federal government to cease the

- 2 collection of state motor fuel taxes in Georgia so that the state can collect and distribute the
- 3 taxes without the delay caused by federal collection and disbursement.
- 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be delivered to the
- 5 Commissioner of the United States Department of Transportation and to the congressional
- 6 delegation of the State of Georgia.
